Dear Mr. Franklin:

Please accept this as a response to your letter dated August 7, 2019 in which you have requested, on behalf of your client Rivers of Life Fellowship Association Inc., that the City of Vaughan ('the City") consider your client's revised application under the City-Wide Development Charges Deferral Policy ("the policy").

You have asserted in your letter that this development is to establish a new place of worship on the subject lands, which includes community use space such as a gym, multi-purpose rooms, activity rooms and classrooms. As per the City's current policy, development charges can only de deferred, amongst other criteria, if the development provides a service or use normally provided by the City or the Regional Municipality of York.

Places of worship is not a service or use provided by the City or Region, and therefore does not meet the criteria of the policy. The classroom portion is also not eligible under our current policy as you do not have a Ministry of Education school number.

Based on our review of your development, in consultation with Community Services, we are able to provide a deferral on a portion of your development as it relates to community use, that is available to the general public and is similar to a service provided by the City. The portion of your site would consist of the Lower Level, including the gym, multi-purpose rooms and kids' activity rooms. This area is approximately 2,624 square meters.

It is the City's position that the remaining main and upper levels are not available to the general public and is not related to service normally provided by the City or Region and therefore do not meet the criteria of the policy.

RE: Request for City and Regional Development Charges Deferral Rivers of Life Fellowship Association Inc.; 9111 Keele St City of Vaughan

Weston Consulting are the planners for the Rivers of Life Fellowship Association Inc., a non-profit organization that owns the property located at 9111 Keele St. in the City of Vaughan. On May 1, 2019, City Council approved Zoning By-law Amendment File Z.17.039 and Site Development File DA.16.061. These approvals permit the development of the subject lands for a place of worship with ancillary land uses as described in the approved Zoning By-law.

We have reviewed the "*City-Wide Development Charges Deferral Policy*" and are requesting a deferral of both City and Regional development charges (DC's) for the proposed approved development of the subject lands.

The deferral is being requested as the Rivers of Life Fellowship Association is a non-profit volunteer group that is establishing a new place of worship, with ancillary community supportive uses on the subject lands. The Fellowship provides a broad range of community and social services that supports the development of a healthy and complete community. Development charges place a substantial financial burden on the congregation that is best deferred so that fund-raising can focus on the funds required for the construction of the new facility. This will allow for the continuation and expansion of the social and community services provided by the Fellowship as they move into their new and larger facility.

In support of this request, please find attached a letter from the Fellowship providing details on the current and future activities being undertaken by the Fellowship.

#### Services Provided by the Fellowship

The Rivers of Life Fellowship Association delivers a series of social services that are normally provided by the City of Vaughan and the Region of York as well as a range of other social and community services.

These include:

- Community Events and Activities: The proposed building will be used by members of the community and public for social events and celebrations;
- Social Outreach: The Fellowship works with the community to address the needs and concerns of persons beyond the congregation. Events open to the public are scheduled in the existing facilities and this will be expanded in the new facilities;
- Homeless and the Needy: The Fellowship provides assistance to people who are homeless, hungry or otherwise disadvantaged. This occurs on an as-needed and emergency basis including the collection and distribution of food and supplies to those in need;
- Youth: The Fellowship organizes activities for youth in the community. These include evening, weekend and summer activities. All of these activities are open to the public;
- Library: The proposed development will incorporate a library space where members of the public, and the congregation, can sign out books for reading and reference;
- **Recreational Activities**: The Fellowship organizes a broad range of youth sports and recreational activities that would also be available to members of the public. This includes an open gym and sports camps in the summer;
- **Facility Rental**: Similar to municipal community centres, meeting rooms and the gym will be available to members of the public for rent. This provides an important resource to the community and helps support the non-profit Fellowship.

#### Vaughan Official Plan

From a policy perspective, the proposed place of worship, with community supportive uses, is part of the City's definition of a '*Complete Community*' as the Fellowship's services help "*meet people's needs for daily living*".

Policy 7.2.1 specifically includes 'places of worship' as part of the 'Community services and facilities' needed in the community. This policy further states that 'Community services and facilities should be integrated into existing and New Community Areas'. The proposed development is to be located near the border of Wards 3 and 4 allowing it to serve both the Maple

community and the Concord/Thornhill North community. The site is also on a Regional Road with regular transit service.

This policy also notes that "A variety of private and non-governmental organizations provide community services and facilities that improve the quality of life for Vaughan residents and employees, augmenting community infrastructure provided by Vaughan and York Region". The services provided by the Fellowship at the new facility support and enhance the social and community services available in the City of Vaughan.

### **Other DC Deferrals**

The City has provided deferrals to other organizations over the past several years, even when the service being provided is not specifically provided by the City or Region. These include:

- **Hospice Vaughan**: City Council approved a request to defer DC's for Hospice Vaughan. While Hospice services are not provided by the City or Region, as per the DC deferral policy, Council and staff agreed that the social service provided by Hospice Vaughan was beneficial to the Community and worthy of Councils support;
- Vitanova Foundation: Similar to above, City staff supported, and Council approved, a request by the Vitanova Foundation to defer development charges. As noted in the staff report, the Vitanova Foundation provides "*shelter and addiction services to individuals and families*". While these services are not provided by the Municipality, both City staff and Council determined that they were worthy of support.

The Rivers of Life Fellowship provides place of worship and community support services that are also worthy of the City's support. As discussed above, the Fellowship augments services already provided in the community while also expanding community services into areas not normally provided by the City. The breadth of services provided by the Fellowship "contribute directly to the health and social wellbeing of communities" (Policy 7.2.1).

#### Support Material

The Rivers of Life Fellowship Association Inc. is a registered charitable organization as required by the City's DC deferral policy. Attached please find the following support material:

- Parcel register showing ownership of the subject lands;
- Confirmation from the Government of Canada of the Association's charitable organization status.
- We also confirm that the proposed place of worship, with ancillary community supportive uses, is available to the general public.

It would be greatly appreciated if a report could be sent to City Council authorizing the appropriate staff to prepare a Deferral Agreement for City-wide DC's. Also, if this could be coordinated with Region of York Financial staff so that the Association's Regional DC's could be deferred as well, that would be more than welcome.

I am writing to thank you for your letter dated June 3, 2019 regarding Rivers of Life Fellowship Association Inc. – Application for Deferral Development Charges; 9111 Keele St, City of Vaughan (the City"). Stating that a place of worship is not a service or use provided by the city or Region, and therefore does not meet the criteria of City-wide Development Charges Deferral Policy ("the policy").

Please allow me to introduce our Place of worship's nature and services/uses and how Spiritual services and other services provided by Rivers of Life can demonstrate that the spirit of the policy can suggest that such services should be considered for DC deferrals, and therefore recommending that a specific exception to the policy be approved.

Rivers of Life fellowship is proposing 2-storey 6,942 square meter Master Plan Place of worship with 3.605 square meter phase one on a land owned by Rivers of Life fellowship. The proposed place of worship is intended to better meet the **spiritual need** of the City of Vaughan's community. The land is on the south side of Rutherford Road and east of Keele and is the subject of Site Plan application DA.16.061. Rivers of Life fellowship is a registered non-profit organization providing services since 1997 that are available to the general public and in good standing.

In 2005, Council adopted a City Wide DCs Deferral Policy ("the Policy") setting out the qualifying criteria enabling all qualified applicants to receive deferral of the City of Vaughan's City Wide DCs. Deferral for services/uses provided by the City of Vaughan or the Regional Municipality of York or any local board thereof may be considered under the policy.

#### **Rivers of Life fellowship and its role in the Community:**

Our Church is fulfilling a variety of needs within the community and helps to meet the objectives of building safe, healthy and complete communities. We provide for multiple functions all week long and/or all day long. We also provide space for non-profit essential activities, hubs of information and gathering places. This helps to create community cohesion and to assist people in their everyday lives, **Spiritual services** and other services provided by Rivers of Life fellowship are services provided to the general public of the City of Vaughan and Ontario.



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#### Some of Rivers of Life Community Services/uses

Worship and preaching Ministry to fulfill the spiritual needs, with Pastoral counseling in daily basis, Prayer meetings everyday, with a lot of different ministries to serve the community,

<u>Outreach Ministry</u>: Outreach ministries are called to deal with the needs and concerns of persons beyond the congregation, relating the ministry of the local church to the needs of the world through compassion, justice, and advocacy.

**Homeless Ministry:** It is the intentional interaction between Christians and homeless persons, regardless of their faith. The ministering typically occurs in the environment in which the homeless reside. It may include distribution of provisions such as food, clothing, and blankets. The ministry often involves building relationships with the homeless and providing them with information and relational care. Prayer, conversation, and ministering to spiritual needs are part of the process.

<u>Needy ministry:</u> the Needy Ministry provides a vehicle through which a comprehensive and compassionate ministry can take place to the members of Rivers of Life and to the surrounding community. It touches and provides assistance to people who are homeless, hungry or disadvantaged and in need on an emergency basis. One of the special efforts of this ministry is achieved by providing groceries, and non-perishable items for families at Christmas time. Additionally, this ministry is a testament that God is a provider to those who have various needs and are to be supported and encouraged.

Youth and Children Care Ministry: The Mission of Rivers of Life youth and Children's Ministry is "To see youth and children come to know Christ and be Biblically disciples, to consistently grow in Christ, develop a Biblical World-view, and serve Him." The Vision of The Rivers of Life youth and Children's Ministry is "To reach into the lives of children in our church and community with the Gospel, portray the love of Christ and teach them the things of the Lord." We count it an awesome privilege and responsibility to reach and teach these little ones for Him! With a big heart for the local community and the world. Everybody is welcome to our meetings and our camps.

**<u>Cell Group Ministry:</u>** Cell groups are made of small numbers of Christians, often between 6 and 12, and led by a cell group leader. Members may be in the same cell group because of common locality, schools or interests. Cell group meetings are usually not conducted in the church sanctuary, if any, but in any of the members' homes, rooms in the church building or other third-party venues. Cell group meetings may consist of a fellowship meal, communion, prayer, worship, sharing or Bible study and discussion.

<u>Facility rental</u> Our building will become a valuable tool for mission and meeting community need. Renting the Sanctuary or the meeting rooms, classrooms or the gym will give a wider use of the building by the community.

**Recreation Ministry:** Rivers of Life has an outstanding ministry of Recreation. Over 200 children and youth play team sports throughout the year. We offer programs for Soccer, Basketball, Volley ball and open gym for our members and the community. A sports camp for these sports and more will be held during the summer. Highly qualified and Christ centered coaches are recruited from parents and other interested adults. Also we have dancing Club and Awana Program to empower the local church with biblical, relevant and easy to use discipleship programs.

Library and book store Ministry: Our Library is open on Sunday mornings before and after the worship service. In mid-fall, we also celebrate our Library with a special day of its own, complete with games, treats and other surprises. Why not drop in to browse through our offerings? Books, DVDs, church archives and other Christian resources are all available. we are always glad to guide you in your search.



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### Place of worship and its Contribution to Sustainability:

Places of worship can provide a cornerstone to communities and fulfill a multiplicity of functions all day and all year. They can be hubs in the community, providing support services for people's everyday lives. Since they are often an integral component of complete communities, it is important that they are accessible by transit, connected to biking and walking facilities and are in proximity to residential communities.

Rivers of Life provides key services to the general public in the spiritual needs area, while this is not a service performed by the municipality it still contributes to the sustainability of key social and health services to Vaughan residents.

Place of Worship and its important community building role Extract from : City of Vaughan Official Plan 2010 Volume 1 Ch 7.2, Community Services and Facilities and 7.2.1 Supporting the provision of community Services and Facilities:

"Community services and facilities are the wide variety of public programs, buildings and spaces that provide for community health and wellbeing. They include arts and recreation facilities, museums, libraries, community health and resource centres, schools, *places of worship*, day care and long-term care facilities. Vaughan's Active Together Master Plan provides direction for the municipal provision of many of these services and facilities. Community services and facilities also include emergency services such as fire, police and emergency medical services and dispatch centres.

A variety of **private** and non-governmental organizations provide community services and facilities that improve the quality of life for Vaughan residents and employees, augmenting community infrastructure provided by Vaughan and York Region. Public school facilities, provided by school boards, play an important community building role and are a convenient location for many functions beyond education. Places of worship cater to the spiritual needs of a community but also often function as a hub for other activities including celebrations, social services, and child care. Child care providers play an important role for many and contribute to complete communities . The City of Vaughan will continue to be creative in achieving community services and facilities through traditional and non-traditional means to provide optimal resources for all residents and employees. Conveniently located and accessible community services and facilities are critical to the success of municipal programs and services, and contribute directly to the health and social wellbeing of communities. Community services and facilities should be integrated into existing and New Community Areas, and located within Intensification Areas and other central locations in order to facilitate access and use. In addition to programming and service requirements, facilities should be built to the street for prominence and ease of access."

**Conclusion:** Rivers of Life proposed Place of worship that acts as a community center in its nature and services/uses, it offer key services to the general public by providing different **Spiritual services in the spiritual needs area** to the general public, While this is not a service performed by the municipality, it still contributes to the sustainability of **key social and health services to Vaughan residents** that match the spirit of the policy suggesting that such services should be considered for DC deferrals, therefore we are recommending that a specific exception to the policy be approved and to execute a DC Deferral Agreement with Rivers of Life and the City of Vaughan to defer the City of Vaughan's development charges in a form satisfactory to the deputy city manager, Legal and human Resources.

### Purpose

DATE:

To provide additional information further to the Committee of the Whole (1) Deputation of December 3, 2019, by Mr. Kurt Franklin from Weston Consulting, who is requesting a DC deferral for the approved development at 9111 Keele St. on behalf of the Rivers of Life Fellowship Association Inc.

### Background

Further to the response letter from the City to the applicant dated October 29, 2019, there has been follow up correspondence between Financial Planning and Development Finance staff and the applicant. The City received two additional letters from the applicant dated November 13, 2019 in which the City provided a further response, attached hereto as Attachments 1 and 2.

The applicant has requested a deferral of 100% of the City-wide development charges and has referenced a comparison to two recent DC deferrals. The City's policy and past practice has allowed for DC deferrals on space that provides a service or use similar to that of the City or the Region. The City has also approved deferrals for services that receive funding from the Province such as Hospice Vaughan and the Vitanova Foundation as these were found to be in the spirit of the deferral policy. There has also been a previous DC deferral for community use space within a place of worship, but it was not for 100% of the development but only the gross floor area that was provided as community use.

#### Conclusion

The City's current position with respect to the site development for Rivers of Life Fellowship Association at 9111 Keele St., is to defer development charges on 2,873 square metres of the master plan build, which is approximately 42% of the entire development.

After a lengthy 5 years dealing with the city of Vaughan, York Region and the Toronto Region conservation authority, finally we applied for building permit on Nov 1st and the whole congregation is excited to start the project ASAP.

We understand that in order for the building permit to be issued all Development charges has to be deferred or paid.

As we are still finalizing the DC deferral with the city and we are waiting for a council meeting on Dec 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 we were informed that it will be a lengthy process,

We would like to consider our project similar to projects located within the VMC area and be eligible not for an 18-month deferral on DC payment but only 6-month subject to a letter of credit being supplied to the City for the entire deferral amount. Once the DC payment is finalized, the payment will be deducted from the letter of credit in full, 6 months after the building permit is issued.

#### Dear Mr. Lotfi:

In response to your two letters dated November 13, 2019 and follow-up to a meeting between yourself, Nelson Pereira, Manager Development Finance and Michael Marchetti, Director Financial Planning and Development Finance, you requested that City of Vaughan:

- 1. Re-review the deferral request based on the latest drawing layouts.
- 2. Confirm whether the City would accept a security in advance of the DC deferral in order to expedite building permit issuance.

In reviewing similar types of developments in which a DC deferral was provided, the areas where the predominate or permanent use was as a place of worship or sanctuary were not considered for the deferral. Areas that were made available to the general public and offered programming and services similar to those of a City community centre were available to be deferred. In reviewing the latest set of drawing layouts, the total gross floor area recommended for the DC deferral is 2,873 square metres for your master plan build, as this area consists of space used for services and programming available to the general public and consistent with those provided by the City. This is an increase from the original DC deferral recommendation of 2,624 square metres due to a reclassification of space. Under Phase 1, the amount available for deferral would be 1,353 square metres. This deferral would be for the City's portion of development charges. The Region would assess for their own deferral.

In regard to the request of accepting a security in lieu of payment of development charges, the recommendation would be that you provide us a certified cheque as a cash security in the total amount of the City's development charges which would constitute as a security. Once the DC deferral is finalized, the City would return the certified cheque to you and you would provide us with a new cheque in the amount of the actual development charges payable. The security would only be for the Phase 1 area of 3,605.4 square metres. At this time there is no mechanism or policy that would allow the City to accept a letter of credit in lieu of development charges. Also the City does not have any precedent set in allowing this type of transaction.

I understand that you are looking for 100% deferral of development charges, however based on our current policy and previous deferrals for similar uses, the City cannot recommend 100% deferral. We are currently proposing to defer 42% of your development.
