The City offers pocketbook relief in the form of the Elderly Home Assistance Program and the Seniors, Low-Income Seniors & Low-Income Disabled Persons' Property Tax Deferral Program, among other initiatives; and,				
current study undervand wastewater ser	Thereas, the City remains committed to finding other ways to provide relief to all residents, including a irrent study underway for a comprehensive review of the existing rate structure for the delivery of water and wastewater services to residents and businesses, such as the costs to provide the service, future set management reserve requirements and structure of the rate to ensure transparency, fairness and istainability; and,				
	Whereas, a component of the study is to consider the feasibility, cost and logistics of a high-water consumption forgiveness program; and,				
	hereas, staff will be reporting to Council in Q2 of 2021 with an update on the study, including an proach to address instances of accidental high-water consumption, including but not limited to, imbing leaks.				
It is therefore recommended that:					
1. That City staff take the appropriate steps to ensure the \$6,433.49 (approximate) water bill from Alectra for Mr. John Henry Royce, resident of Pennon Road in Kleinburg, be entirely waived.
