


York Region Seniors Strategy Where We Have Been







What is Underway:

- Paramedics: CP@Clinic Expansion; CP@LTC (data, gaps); Paramedics Training – Palliative Care; Paramedics – Treat and Release
- Ontario Health Teams: Participating in related OHT sector tables and working groups

Supporting Age Friendly Complete Communities



What is the Focus: Better Integrated Services

- New models of integrated service locations provide opportunities to respond to seniors needs holistically (Hub, Campus of Care)
- Senior friendly affordable housing options and supports

- MCR Planning Process
 - Planning for higher-density rental and ownership structures
 - Diversity and Inclusion policy considerations for inclusionary language, engagement and core principle of planning


