Site Context Plan

The City of Vaughan is making progress on developing a new 7.7-hectare (19-acre) district park at the northwest corner of Peter Rupert Avenue and Rutherford Road. The proposed park will be dynamic, welcoming and inspiring, and it will feature a wide range of amenities for the entire community to enjoy.

The park rests within a study area of approximately 28.5 hectares (70 acres) of greenspace including parkland, open space trails, stormwater ponds, and the Cook Woodlot with connections to the Rutherford GO station. With places and spaces for kids to play, event staging for concerts, relaxing seating zones and so much more, people of all ages and abilities will be able to relax and enjoy this new outdoor amenity area.






Phasing Plan

Phasing of the new district park is necessary due to servicing required for the splash pad and washroom building which will be provided from the adjacent future development. These future services will not prevent the City from proceeding with the construction of Phase 1 of the park with key facilities and amenities for the local community to start enjoying in the next few years.

Phase 1 of the park will include a district level playground facility, asphalt pathways, trail connections to the Cooks Woodlot, an open air amphitheater and gathering space, picnic shelters, and local off-leash dog area.



CATEGORY: INDIVIDUAL/GROUP

This category recognizes an individual or a group of individuals who advocate for positive change, inspires others and makes significant contributions to improving the overall quality of life for people with disabilities.

Eligibility

The nominee) must be:

- a resident of the City of Vaughan
- Individuals, groups or posthumous nomination

Ineligible Nominations

- Self nominations
- elected federal, provincial or municipal politician currently in office
- City of Vaughan's Committee, Board or Task Force members
- The City of Vaughan employee(s)
- Vaughan Public Library
- A current member of the VAAC
- Nominee with a COI as defined by the Municipal Act

EVALUATION

- Profile or visibility of the nominee within the community as a role model or a leader in accessibility and inclusion.
- Evidence of collaboration and partnership results in measurable improvement for people living with disabilities.
- Innovation to service with measurable improvement related to access and inclusion for people living with a disability. OR
- Description of product invented with descriptions of intended impact for people living with disabilities.



CATEGORY: SMALL/ MEDIUM/ LARGE BUSINESS OR ORGANIZATION (including non-profit and for-profit)

Nominations should be for initiatives and achievements undertaken in the past two calendar years. The business or organization can either

- provide goods or services to people with disabilities in the City of Vaughan and go above and beyond to enrich the lives of people with disabilities.
- shows leadership in integrating and providing barrier-free working conditions for people with disabilities that goes beyond the compliance of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005.
- has made measurable progress in the recruitment, hiring, retention and advancement to leadership positions of individuals with disabilities.

CATEGORY: SMALL/ MEDIUM/ LARGE BUSINESS OR ORGANIZATION (including non-profit and for-profit)

Eligibility

The business or organizations the nominee must be:

- Located in York Region
- Small businesses are businesses with 1 to 99 employees;
- Medium-sized businesses are businesses with 100 to 499 employees;
- Large businesses are businesses with 500 employees or more.

Ineligible Nominations

- Self nominations
- elected federal, provincial or municipal politician currently in office
- City of Vaughan's Committee, Board or Task Force members
- The City of Vaughan employee(s)
- Vaughan Public Library
- A current member of the VAAC
- Nominee with a COI as defined by the Municipal Act



EVALUATION

- Evidence of work done to increase labour market participation.
- Evidence that the local community has benefited from the endeavour of the nominee. E.g., Advocating inclusion in other areas of the community beyond the labour market.
- Demonstrated excellence in minimizing barriers to employment



CATEGORY: YOUTH LEADERSHIP

This category recognizes a young person, between 4 and 24 years old, who shows leadership and commitment to improvising accessibility for people with disabilities.

Eligibility

The nominee must be:

- a resident of the City of Vaughan
- Individuals or posthumous nomination



Ineligible Nominations

- Self nominations
- elected federal, provincial or municipal politician currently in office
- City of Vaughan's Committee, Board or Task Force members
- The City of Vaughan employee(s)
- Vaughan Public Library
- A current member of the VAAC
- Nominee with a COI as defined by the Municipal Act

EVALUATION

- Profile or visibility of the nominee within the community as a role model or a leader in accessibility and inclusion.
- Evidence of collaboration and partnership results in measurable improvement for people living with disabilities. OR
- Innovation to service with measurable improvement related to access and inclusion for people living with a disability. OR
- Description of product invented with descriptions of intended impact for people living with disabilities.
- Evidence to support the impact of public education and awareness campaigns or activities (i.e. metrics from social media, number of participants in workshops or information sessions, number of workshops or information sessions provided, etc.) OR
- Promote full inclusion and citizenship through increased labour market participation

REQUIRED INFORMATION

- The nominee's first name, last name, email address and phone number.
- The nominator's first name, last name, email address and phone number.
- Consent to be nominated
- A detailed description of the nominee's work and initiatives in one of the four categories.
- 2-5 Testimonials



TESTIMONIALS


The parties providing testimonials will be asked to provide clear examples of contributions using some or all of the following attributes:

- Leadership
- Innovation to service for people living with accessibility
- Invention of a product for people with disabilities
- Collaboration and partnership
- Public education and awareness campaigns or activities
- Furthering the development of accessibility
- Demonstrated commitment to recruiting, hiring, and training of people with disabilities.
- Impact on community and individuals with disabilities

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

May include additional materials such as

- news articles
- Community, committee, business or not-for-profit organization profiles



NOMINATION FORM

- The Nomination Form has been expanded to collect details to aid nominators in supporting the nomination and the AAC in the selection process.
- In order to complete the nomination package, the party putting forward the nomination will be required to provide 2 -5 testimonials which support notable achievements including professional and volunteer activities and their significance or initiatives and activities as described under each category.


