PLANNING'S RESERVED STREET NAME LIST**

ACTION: DECISION

Purpose

To seek approval for proposed street names with varying themes compiled by the Development Planning Department, as shown on attachment no.1. If approved, these street names will be added to Development Planning's reserved street name list. This eliminates the need for Council to review a street name and expedites the street naming process for approved developments, and the issuance of addresses and building permits.

Report Highlights

- The proposed street names represent a variety of themes that celebrate Vaughan, Canadian landmarks, history and culture, as well as other landmarks around the world.
- If approved, these street names will be added to Development Planning's reserved street name list. This eliminates the need for Council to review a street name and expedites the street naming process for approved developments, and the issuance of addresses and building permits.
- York Region and the Vaughan Fire and Rescue Services Department have reviewed the names and have no comments against approving the proposed street names.
- The Development Planning Department supports the approval of the street names, as they are consistent with the City's Street Naming Policy and Procedures that were approved by Vaughan Council on December 10, 2013.

Recommendation

1. That the street names as shown in attachment 1 BE APPROVED and added to Development Planning's reserved street name list. This eliminates the need for Council to review a street name, and expedites the street naming process for approved developments, and the issuance of addresses and building permits.

The York Region, Community Planning and Development Services Department has no objection to the proposed street names. The Development Planning Department and the Fire and Rescue Departments have reviewed the names for appropriateness and determined the proposed names to be satisfactory.

The proposed street names are consistent with the City's Street Naming Policy and Procedures that were approved by Vaughan Council on December 10, 2013. Staff on April 14, 2022, circulated the proposed street names to each Council member and received no comments.

The proposed street names are not the result of a charity fundraising auction/event.

Broader Regional Impacts/Considerations

The York Region Community Planning and Development Services Department have no objection to the proposed street names.

The Vaughan Development Planning Department has no objection to the proposed street names as the names are consistent with the City's Street Naming Policy and has been reviewed and approved by York Region and the Vaughan Fire and Rescue Services Department.
