The Ontario Food Terminal

Canada's largest wholesale fruit and produce terminal is a 20-minute drive from Vaughan.

Ontario is one of the largest and most competitive food and beverage clusters in North America with annual manufacturing revenues of more than \$37 billion.

Ontario has the highest number of restaurants and bars in the country, generating \$33 billion in annual sales and employing 466,200 people.

Market Access

OPPORTUNITIES AND INCENTIVES

Scientific Research and Experimental Development Tax Incentive – can reduce your after-tax cost between \$37 and \$61 of every \$100 in research and development spending.

Canada-Ontario Job Grant – funding can reduce the cost of training employees by up to 50 to 83 per cent. This can cover up to \$10,000 to \$15,000 in training costs per trainee.

Canadian Agricultural Partnership – Ontario Processors can receive up to 25 to 50 per cent/\$20,000 to \$250,000 in funding for processing of agri-food or beverages.


Canadian Agricultural Partnership - Ontario Producers can receive up to 30 to 50 per cent/\$2,500 to \$100,000 in funding for production of agricultural products.

CanExport - can receive up to 75 per cent to a maximum of \$75,000 per application grant for international trade shows, marketing and translation costs.

Southwestern Ontario Development Fund – large-scale expansion projects can receive up to 10 per cent coverage from grant funding for a portion of overall costs up to \$1.5 million.

Business scale up and productivity program – zero per cent interest loan/up to 25 per cent eligible expenses for large-scale business expansion project.
