Purpose

This report provides an update on key accomplishments from the programs and initiatives undertaken this past year by Economic Development's Strategic Economic Initiatives unit.

Report Highlights

- The Economic Development Department's Strategic Economic Initiatives (SEI) unit undertakes key strategic projects that establish economic assets upon which our businesses and talent grow.
- In 2022, the SEI unit advanced and expanded the scope of key projects in four areas: Smart Cities Development, Public Art and Art Development, Municipal Partnerships and Economic Asset Development (i.e., Vaughan Healthcare Centre Precinct). These projects aim to promote the growth of the City's business community and attract businesses and talent to Vaughan.
- The SEI Year in Review report provides a snapshot of upcoming transformative, ambitious, and sustainable and purpose-driven projects that will catalyze stakeholders, talent and assets to drive creative placemaking in 2023.

In 2022, the SEI unit accelerated and expanded the scope of key projects to help build Vaughan's economic resilience. - ▶ Three digital billboards activated on City property to generate more than \$405,000 of revenue per year for fifteen years

FEBRUARY

- ▶ Council endorsed a renewed ventureLAB partnership that enhanced innovation and entrepreneurship services
- ▶ The *Activate!Vaughan* Smart City Challenge received a Gold Award from the Economic Development Council of Ontario (EDCO)

APRIL

- ▶ The Government of Ontario announced an investment of \$2.5 million in ventureLAB partnership with Sterling Industries to open a first-of-its-kind MedTech Lab in Vaughan for local health-tech entrepreneurs

Smart Cities Development

A smart city uses technology to solve civic challenges, provides businesses with a climate for growth and improves the quality of life and standard of living for residents.

Purpose-driven

Smart City Task Force

The City's Smart City Task Force had an overall mandate to make recommendations to ensure the City is advancing a culture of knowledge and continuous improvement. Through stakeholder engagement held in June 2022, the task force established a Smart City Development Roadmap.

2022 Accomplishments

Vaughan Council approved a findings and recommendations report, including an approved Smart City vision, guiding principles, strategic objectives, a framework and project prioritization for the 2022-2026 Term of Council.

City-wide Smart City Project Highlights

As a Smart City leader, the City seeks new and meaningful ways to incorporate innovative solutions into ongoing city-building efforts.

2022 Project Highlights

Led by Office of the City Manager:

- ▶ Partnered with York University's YSpace to support tech entrepreneurs in testing their innovative Smart City and IoT-based technology ideas.
- ▶ The Government of Ontario invested \$2.5 million in a ventureLAB partnership with Sterling Industries to open a first-of-its-kind MedTech Lab in Vaughan for local health-tech entrepreneurs.



Led by Legal and Administrative Services:

- ▶ Offered online voting during the Advance Vote period for the City's 2022 Municipal Election. The online voting platform met the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) standards.

Led by Infrastructure Development:

- ▶ The Rutherford and Maple GO Mobility On-Request Pilot was launched to make commuting to and from GO stations in Vaughan easier.

Led by Planning and Growth Management:

- ▶ Established a paperless development planning application process allowing citizens and industry professionals to submit application development electronically, with a secured login.

Led by Public Works:

- ▶ Launched SmartParks to allow park visitors to access amenity and facility bookings, report a problem and make a service request with the scan of a QR code on their smartphone.
- ▶ Installed a new system in City vehicles called the Road Patrol Manager to detect road deficiencies (such as potholes, sign obstructions, faulty streetlights, graffiti and more) as City staff drive around and work throughout the community.
- ▶ Installed a stormwater pond monitoring system called loticiti that automatically monitors the quantity and quality of stormwater in select City ponds, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- ▶ Enhanced tree maintenance operations using map-based technology.

Award-winning Smart City Initiatives

The City achieved the Smart Cities Early Adopter International Organization of Standardization (ISO) 37122 certifications from the World Council on City Data.

Vaughan is among the first cities worldwide to be certified under this new Smart City standard, joining an early adopter cohort of 10 cities globally.

In 2023, Vaughan will begin collecting data for ISO 37123 Indicators for Resilient Cities and become a global early adopter of that certification. More importantly, the City will be among only a handful worldwide that have obtained a triple certification under the ISO 37120 series.

***Activate!Vaughan* Smart City Challenge wins Gold Award from the Economic Development Council of Ontario (EDCO)**

The EDCO Awards of Excellence is a well-established program recognizing outstanding economic development initiatives in Ontario.

The *Activate!Vaughan* Smart City Challenge called on businesses to propose innovative Smart City technologies to enhance the quality of life in Vaughan. The challenge brought together City departments, industry partners, startups and scaleups to address the challenges of today and the future.

More than 24 targeted, high-potential startups participated in the Smart City Challenge programming, which included innovation workshops, five live Q and A sessions and 56 mentorship meetings with industry partners. The *Activate!Vaughan* program awarded \$90,000 in grant funding to 15 ventures which will help them invest in commercialization, business expansion and job creation.

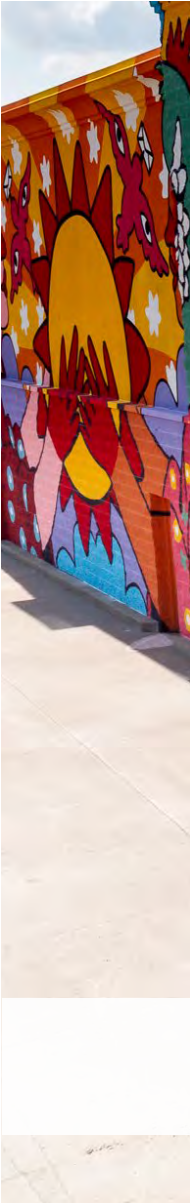

Its role in animating the public realm contributes to the urban character of Vaughan and attracts businesses, talent and creative community-builders.

Public Art Advances Creative Placemaking in 2022

Live and upcoming

- ▶ Public art in the Vaughan Metropolitan Centre (VMC) continues to leverage the creative potential in the emerging downtown area, cultivating its authentic metropolitan identity as a distinctive cultural destination.
- ▶ In VMC North, design development is nearing completion for Cortel Group's EXPO City CG Tower Public Art installation overlooking Edgeley Pond and Park. The monumental, sculptural piece, Edgeley Pond Fathom, slated for installation in late 2023 alludes to the previous industrial life of the area through a transformation-themed storyline paying homage to the landscape, history of the land and the story of Black Creek.
- ▶ In VMC South, QuadReal's Assembly Park Outdoor Gallery Program launched in the summer with the inaugural curated exhibition, Transitions, which featured the work of resident and Greater Toronto Area (GTA) artists.

- ▶ Public art planning is underway for several upcoming VMC installations, including:
 - SmartCentres' VMC East Block North major gateway feature at the corner of Jane Street and Portage Parkway, which is in the design concept phase.
 - A substantial on-site contribution of \$2.1 million was secured through the Metrus (Terra) Property Inc. development for a future gateway public art installation at Highway 7 and Jane Street.

- ▶ Citywide | The City-led ARTonBOXES Program will launch through its Group of Seven REMIXED pilot phase in spring 2023. It will debut original art on designated traffic signal boxes in high-profile, publicly accessible locations across all five wards of the city.


Municipal Partnerships

Alternative Revenue Generation

The Municipal Partnership Office aims to generate alternative sources of revenue for City programs, projects and services to alleviate the tax burden on citizens. The three priority focus areas include city-wide grant support, revenue-generating asset development and internal program support.

In 2022, Economic Development secured \$9.1 million in total advertising, sponsorship and grant revenue that offsets the tax base in support of projects across the corporation, including those that support the economy.

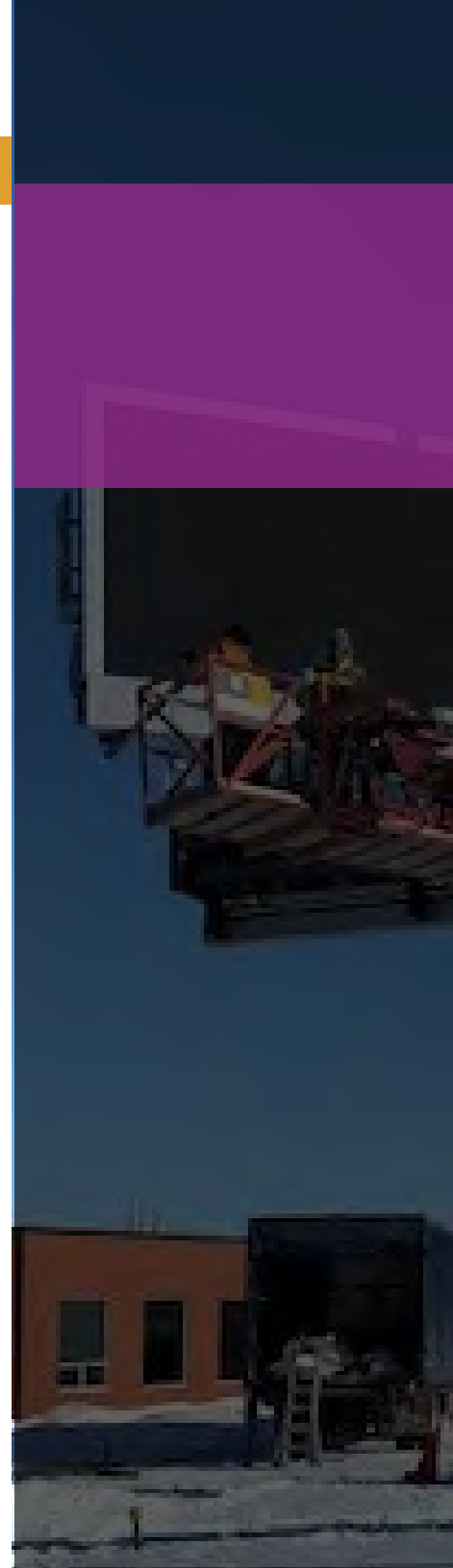

Digital Billboard Revenue Project

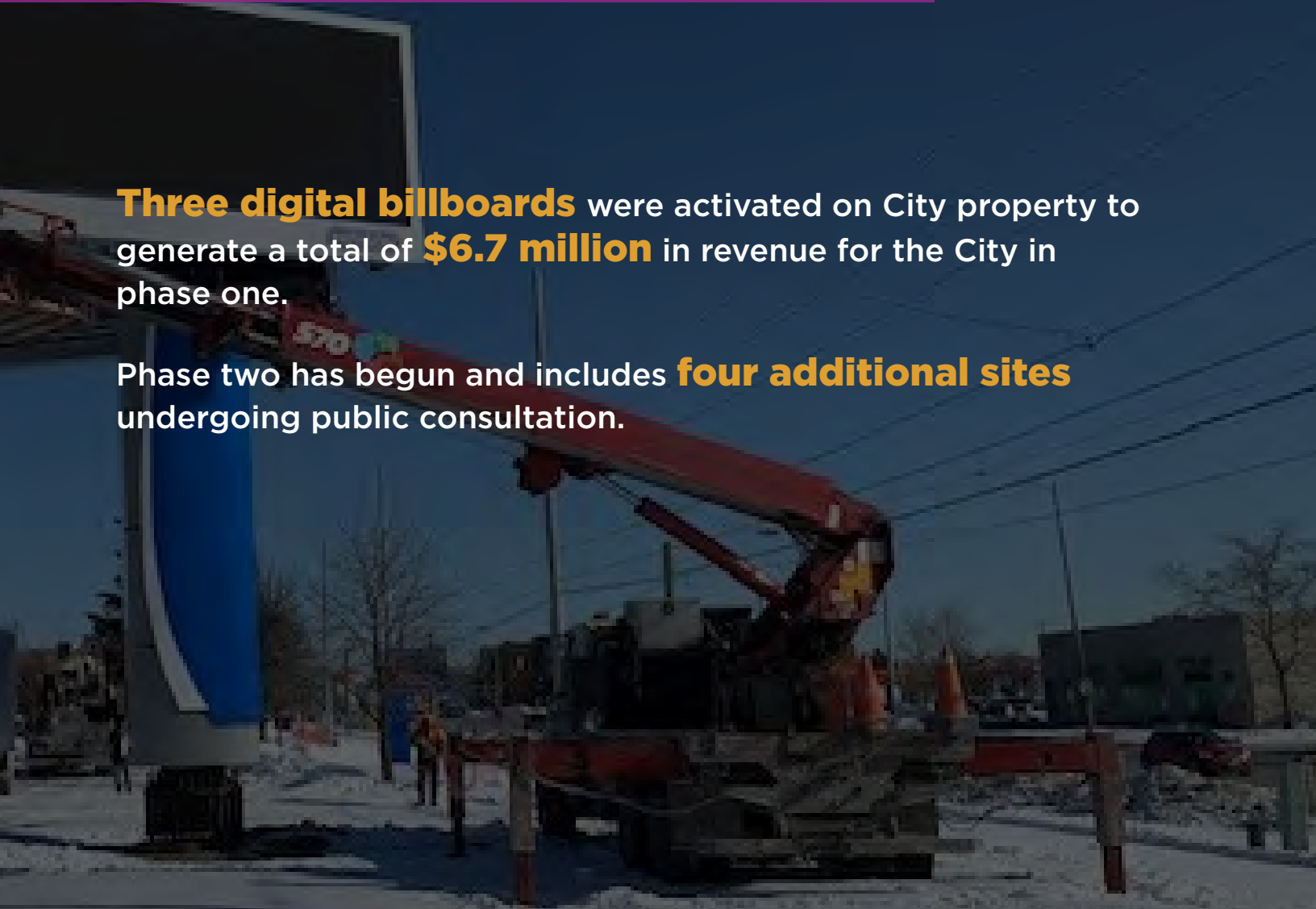
The Digital Billboard Revenue Project is the City's first public/private partnership whereby City-owned property is leased to out-of-home advertising companies in a revenue-share lease agreement.



2022 Accomplishments

Three digital billboards were activated on City property to generate a total of **\$6.7 million** in revenue for the City in phase one.

Phase two has begun and includes **four additional sites** undergoing public consultation.



Purpose-driven

Internal Program Support

When internal City departments are looking to generate alternative sources of revenue (whether through a sponsorship program or grant opportunity) to offset their expenses, the SEI unit provides advisory support from the ideation phase to implementation.



2022 Accomplishments

Through **Green Guardians**, the Parks, Forestry and Horticulture Operations department was supported with two programs: the Grow with Vaughan Horticulture Sponsorship Program and the Corporate Tree Planting Program. Entering its third year, Grow with Vaughan has generated more than **\$130,000** in revenue since inception, which helps offset operational costs.

Supported Recreation Services with two programs: the local community sponsorship program for **Toyota National Championships and the RecAssist Fee Subsidy Program**. Hosted in Vaughan by Canada Soccer from Oct. 5 to Oct. 10, 2022, a total of **\$82,500** in revenue was generated to offset the Toyota National Championships by the Municipal Accommodation Tax. In addition, philanthropic funds were generated for the RecAssist Fee Subsidy program for low-income families in Vaughan who wish to participate in recreation and culture programs.

Supported the City's Development Planning department by providing a presenting sponsor for the **Vaughan Urban Design Awards**, offsetting the awards ceremony's expenses.

Ambitious

Vaughan Healthcare Centre Precinct (VHCP)

Next generation of world-class healthcare in Canada

In a first-of-its-kind initiative, the City is leading a collaboration to transform an 82-acre parcel of land surrounding the site of the Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital (Canada's first smart hospital) into the VHCP. Together with partners Mackenzie Health, York University and ventureLAB, the City is developing a world-class destination in healthcare and health innovation.

Economic Impact

The development of the VHCP will become a regional anchor attracting economic growth and activity and catalyzing future investment in the local economy.

2022 Milestones

In June 2022, Council approved recommendations to:

- enter into a ground-lease amending agreement with Mackenzie Health, enabling expansion of the hospital, developing a long-term care facility and establishing a ventureLAB MedTech lab in future Mackenzie Health facilities.
- transfer land to York University to establish a research, education and innovation facility.



Arts and Creative Industry Hub

The VMC will be the city's future premier arts and cultural district

Cultural hubs offer amenities that create community, social and economic benefits, including city-building and placemaking, investment attraction, job creation, tourism attraction, academic and social innovations, and civic pride.

Vaughan has a vision to become York Region's hub for design excellence and the creative industry with creative spokes across the city. Using a hub-and-spoke model with multiple, yet connected and distinct, spaces for arts and culture established in the VMC enables broader opportunities for activation and participation.

2022 Milestones

In June 2022, the VMC Sub-committee endorsed:

- ▶ the pursuit of a hub-and-spoke model for developing a cultural arts district in the VMC.
- ▶ the launch of a VMC Arts and Creative Industries Advisory Group that will lead co-ordinated efforts to develop, support and build on cultural arts activity in the VMC and the development of arts and cultural amenities that will eventually serve as hubs and spokes.

International Economic Relations

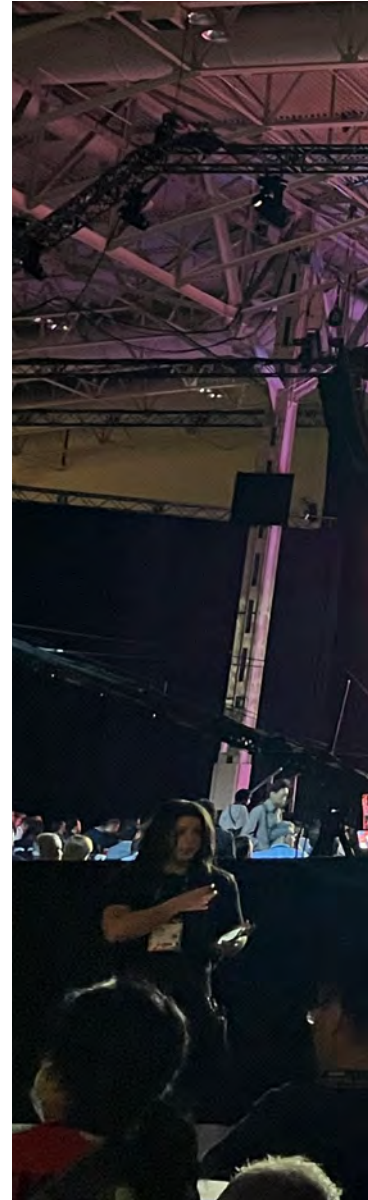
Vaughan is a gateway to Ontario's economy

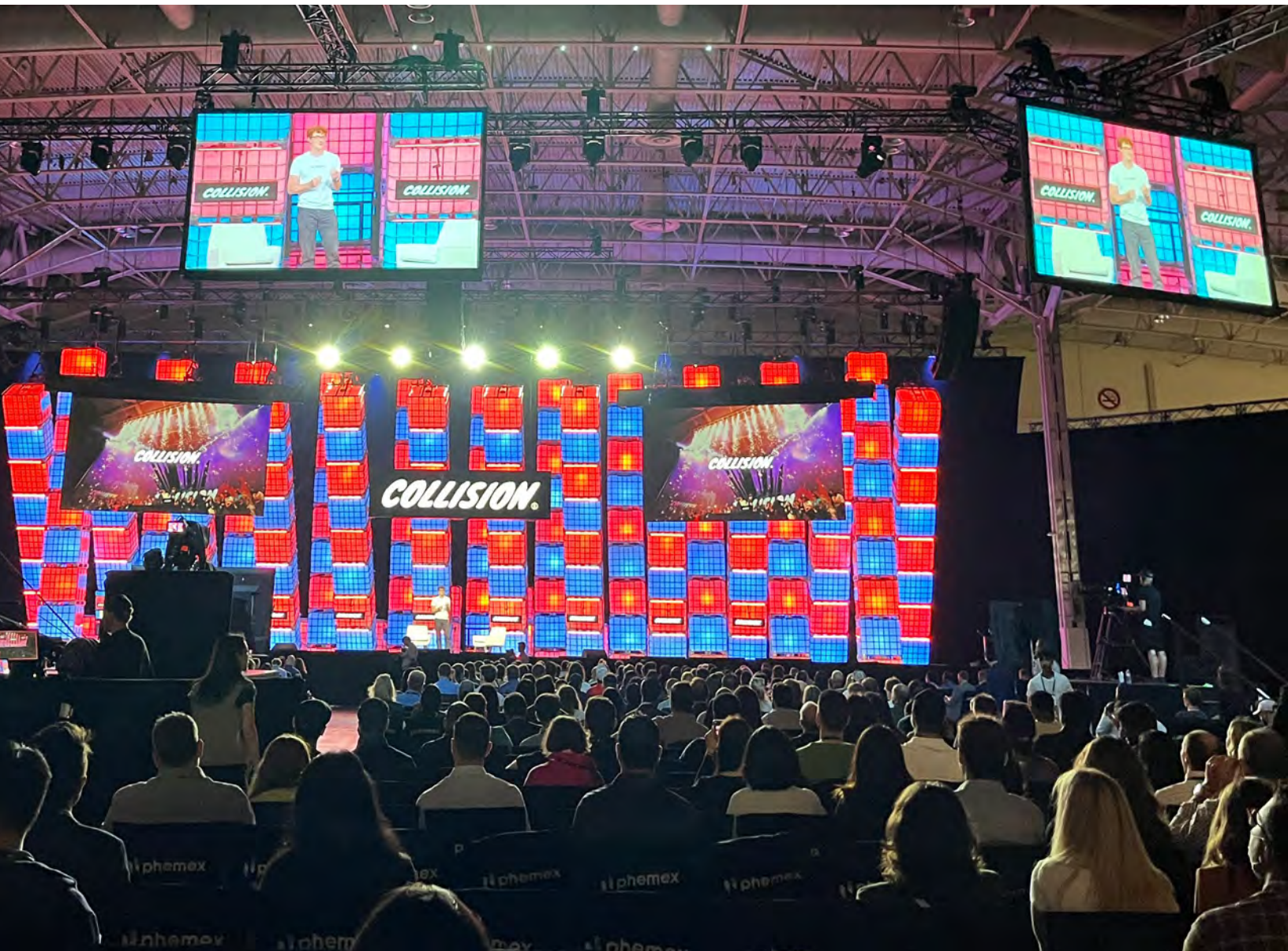
Participating in international trade missions and conferences is an important opportunity to raise the profile of Vaughan's economy among global audiences and generate trade opportunities and investment leads across the city's key sectors.

2022 Activities

Collision Conference - North America's fastest-growing tech conference

- Economic Development leveraged the 2022 Collision Conference to raise the profile of the VHCP and Vaughan's emerging health-technology and life-science sectors. This effort culminated in an announcement at York Region's pavilion for the VHCP partners from the Mayor, Mackenzie Health, York University and ventureLAB.
- Staff made nearly 300 individual connections, including representatives of multi-national firms, high-growth companies, other local, national and international government and public sector organizations, and investment agencies.





Web Summit - Europe's largest technology event

- Staff participated in the 2022 WebSummit conference to undertake trade and foreign direct investment activities, raise the profile of the VHCP among a global audience, observe models for creative placemaking and gain knowledge of best-in-class municipal innovation practices.
- Staff identified cross-border trade opportunities, particularly with gateway economies, to promote and develop Vaughan's key sectors.
- The conference focused on health technology and offered an opportunity to raise the profile of the VHCP as a world-class destination for health innovation by co-ordinating meetings with leading companies, international consulates and global trade organizations.
- Beyond the WebSummit conference, staff advanced the Cultural Arts Centre project by co-ordinating site visits with municipal staff and anchoring cultural organizations in Lisbon to gain knowledge of proven best practices.

Upcoming Strategic Economic Initiatives

Smart Cities Development

Vaughan Transportation Innovation Program

- ▶ Partnering with the Infrastructure Planning and Corporate Asset Management department and seeking Council's endorsement to launch an innovation program focusing on testing smart mobility innovation.

Smart Kiosks

- ▶ Modernizing and supporting our main streets by bringing a business case to Council to install smart kiosks in Vaughan's key commercial neighbourhoods and enhance the visitor experience.

Accessibility Technology Pilot in City Facilities

- ▶ Partnering with the Office of the Chief Human Resource Officer and Facility Management to deploy a two-year accessibility technology pilot to help the visually impaired or blind navigate independently in select City facilities.

Municipal Partnerships and Alternative Revenue Generation

Digital Billboard Revenue Program

Phase two consists of exploring an additional four sites that will move to public consultation pending Council approval in 2023.

Phase three development will begin with exploring future site locations and the revenue potential of current inventory.

Grants

SEI will continue to identify and circulate upcoming eligible grant opportunities citywide. There are 12 grants submitted and pending a decision, valued at more than \$16.5 million. These pending grants include funding for:

- city-wide EV charging stations.
- wetland restoration and an eco-classroom in North Maple Regional Park.
- Jane Street multi-use pathway.
- accessibility technology for the visually impaired.
- smart technology for seniors' recreation programming.
- VPL welcome kits at the new Cortellucci Vaughan Hospital and Auto-tech Detroit-led generation to develop Next-gen Auto in Vaughan.

Economic Asset Development

2023 International Missions

- ▶ Economic Development staff participation in Smart Cities Connect Conference and Expo in Denver, Colorado, in May 2023 to raise the profile of Vaughan's economy and to promote Vaughan's strategic city-building projects (Smart City and Next Generation Health and Healthcare delivery) on a world stage.
- ▶ Economic Development will attend the AutoTech Detroit conference in partnership with York Region and continue developing the Weston Road and Highway 7 corridor, further strengthening Vaughan as a destination for next-generation automotive technology.
- ▶ To advance Vaughan's globally-competitive farm-to-fork food and beverage industry cluster, Economic Development, will attend the international Anuga FoodTec Conference in Cologne, Germany in October 2023, in addition to engagements with northern Italy's food industry cluster.

North Maple Regional Park

SEI is working with the Parks Infrastructure Planning and Development department to support ongoing work to develop North Maple Regional Park into a world-class destination for mixed-use sport, recreation, wellness, education and culture.

Creative Industries Centre of Excellence

SEI is working to formalize a partnership with the McMichael Canadian Art Collection and the Vaughan International Film Festival to advance a Creative Industries Centre of Excellence in Vaughan.
