Purpose

To seek approval for the proclamation requests received for National Deafblind Awareness Month, Brain Injury Awareness Month, and Longest Day of SMILES.

- 4. THAT the proclamations be posted on the City's website and the Corporate and Strategic Communications department be directed to promote the above-noted proclamations through the various corporate channels.

Background

National Deafblind Awareness Month

June is celebrated as National Deafblind Awareness Month, marking the birth month of Helen Keller, who is one of the most famous people who was deafblind. Recognizing this month builds awareness around the distinct experience of Canadians who are deafblind.

Council has previously granted this request for proclamation.

Brain Injury Awareness Month

June is Brain Injury Awareness Month in Canada. As per statistics provided by the Brain Injury Association of York Region, 452 Canadians suffer a serious traumatic brain injury every day. This does not include concussions, non-traumatic brain injuries, military injuries, or unreported cases.

Canadian brain injury associations are working together to spread awareness and advocate the need to change the classification surrounding traumatic brain injuries.

Council has previously granted this request for proclamation.

Longest Day of SMILES

Operation Smile Canada is a volunteer-based global charity that exists to ensure access to safe and effective cleft surgery. The Longest Day of SMILES campaign is a means to raise awareness and funds to help a child born with a cleft condition find free cleft surgery and comprehensive care.

By proclaiming the date of June 18, 2023 as the Longest Day of SMILES, the organization hopes it will raise awareness to provide waiting children with exceptional cleft care and a new smile.

Council has previously granted this request for proclamation.
