The applicant shall be advised that additional variances may be required upon review of detailed drawing for building permit/site plan approval.

The subject lands may be subject to Ontario Regulation 166/06 (TRCA - Toronto and Region Conservation Authority.

The subject lands may be subject to the Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Act, RSO 2001. Please note as of January 1, 2015 Accessible Parking Spaces are subject to the provisions of Ontario Regulation - O.Reg.413/12, Subsections 80.32 through 80.39, which supersede the current by-law requirements in By-law 1-88 as amended.

Please note Section 4.1.1(b) that states the maximum height of an accessory building or structure measured from the average finished ground level to the highest point of the said building or structure shall be 4.5 metres. The nearest part of the roof shall not be more than three(3) metres above finished grade.

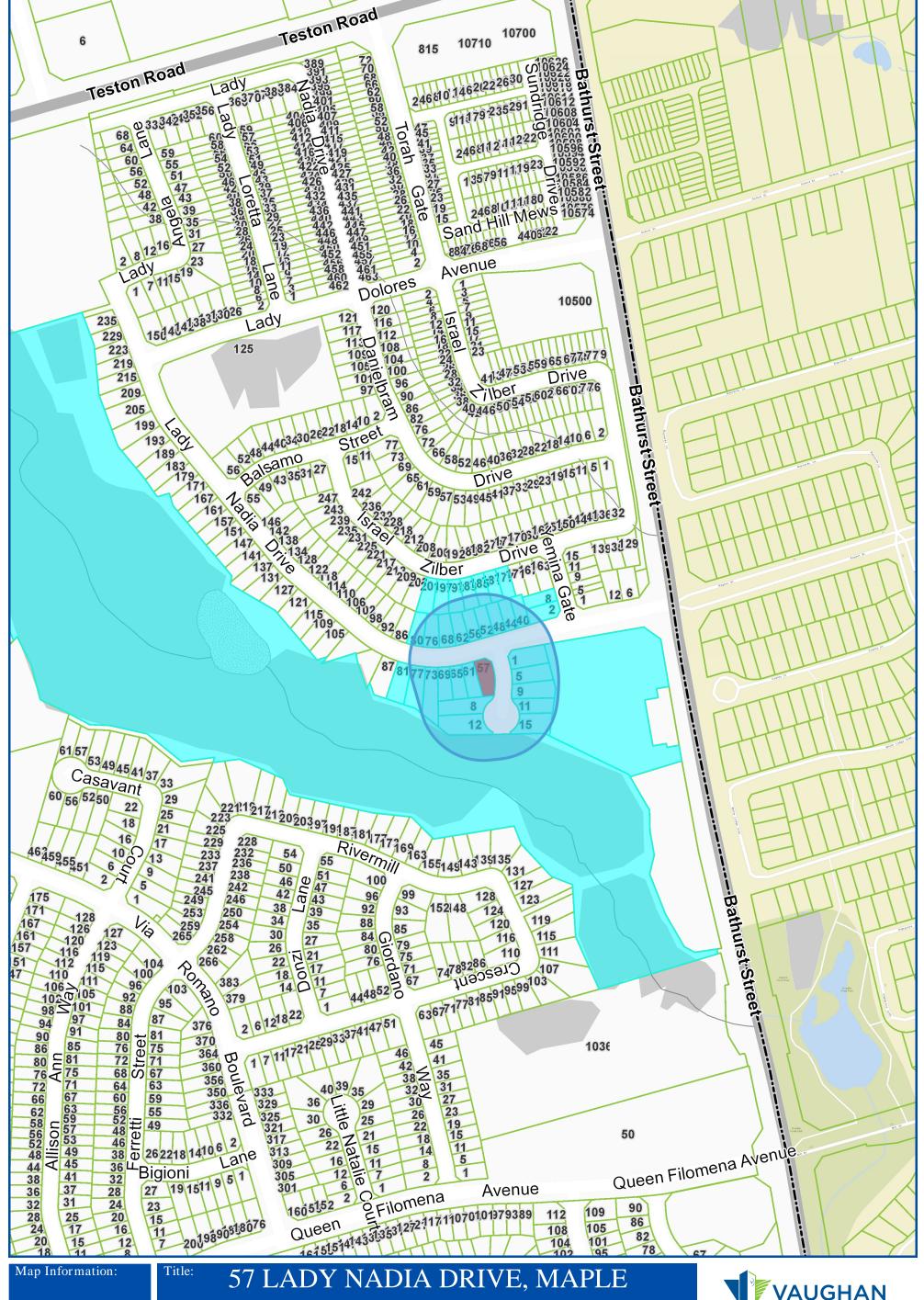

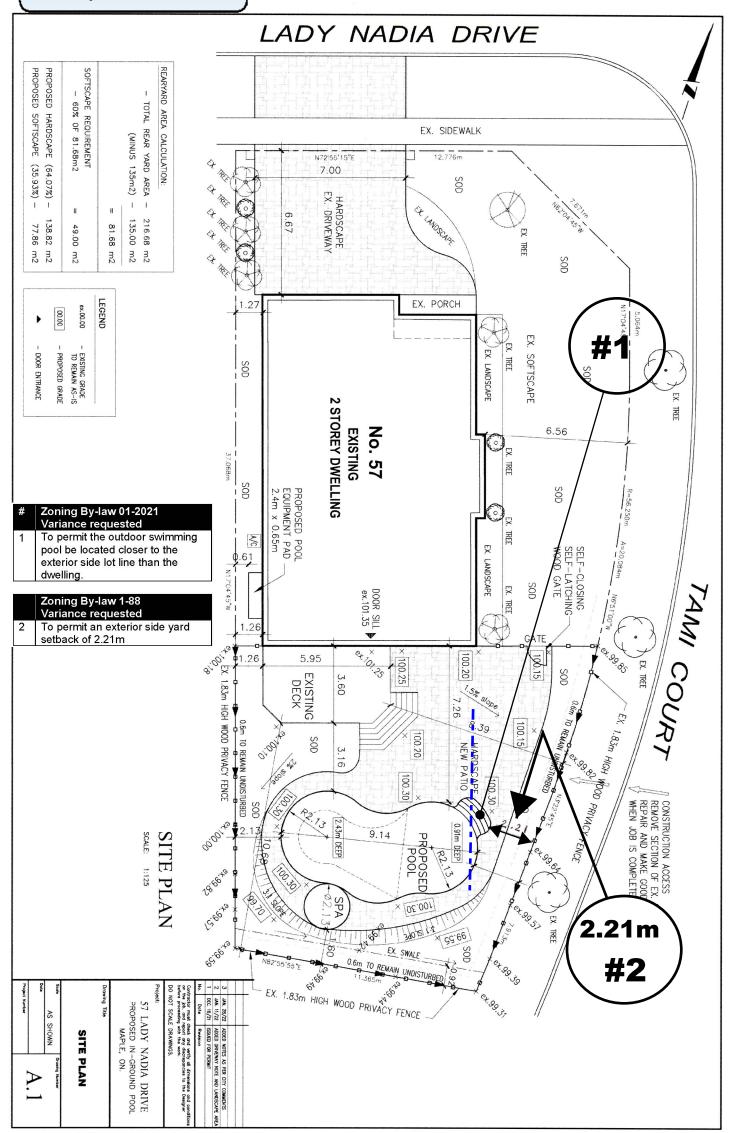

Comments:

The Owner is requesting to construct a swimming pool with the above noted variances.

The Development Planning Department has no objection to the proposed variances, as the reduction in exterior side yard setback to the pool does not visually impact the abutting properties and streetscape. It should be noted the variances only apply to pool's stairs and outer eastern edge, as the majority of area remains in line with the exterior side lot line of the dwelling and more importantly safe access around the water's edge.

In support of this minor variance application, the Owner submitted an Arborist Report and Tree Preservation Plan, prepared by Davey Resource Group, dated February 18, 2022. The Urban Design Division of the Development Planning Department reviewed this information and concur that the proposed works will not cause an adverse impact to the City trees along the boulevard.

The Development Planning Department is of the opinion that the proposal is minor in nature, maintains the general intent and purpose of the Official Plan and Zoning By-law, and is desirable for the appropriate development of the land.

Recommendation:

The Development Planning Department recommends approval of the application.
