STATEMENT OF CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE



ADDRESS: 10841 Jane Street (Heritage Inventory: Property of Interest)
LOT/CONCESSION: Lot 26, Concession 4

HISTORIC VALUE:

10841 Jane Street contains a structure that was once the home of Mrs. George Gray and was used as a school. There were two teachers during the time of its use as a school. The first teacher was Jane Lucas who, when married, became Mrs. Stump, and the second (and last) teacher was Ann J. Lockhart. Having had only two teachers suggests that the school was in operation for a short period of time. There was a monthly fee of twenty-five cents, and students would learn what was called the three r's, which were reading, 'riting, 'rithmetic. The existence of the school within the community gives insight to the education structure that was available in the Teston Village during the time period that this structure was built.

CONTEXTUAL VALUE:

10841 Jane Street is historically, visually, and physically linked to the area. The significance of the structure stems from being a remnant of the historic Village of Teston, which was previously known as Thanestown. The structure is located close to the road on the east side of Jane Street, like many of the structures in the area. The lot also has mature trees.
