STATEMENT OF CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE



ADDRESS: 10967 Jane Street (Heritage Inventory: Property of Interest)
LOT/CONCESSION: Lot 27, Concession 4
DATE: 1874

ARCHITECTURAL VALUE/DESCRIPTION:

10967 Jane Street features a 2- storey structure built in 1874 – originally one storey, but second floor was later added. The main entrance, which faces Jane Street, has a centrally located door, and two windows on the main level, one on either side of the front door. The upper storey mimics the locations and dimensions of these windows, maintaining an elegant symmetry and scale, above the porch that spans the front of the house. A much smaller window is located in the central gable on the front elevation and is likely not accessible from the attic. The cladding on this building has been replaced multiple times, as evident from the historic photography and documentation.

HISTORICAL VALUE:

10967 Jane Street is associated with the Hadwen Family. The selling of the western portion the Lot 27 by John Hadwen, contributed to the development Teston village. There were two structures that were built by the Hadwen family located in the most northern portion of Teston village. The structure at 10967 Jane Street was originally built for hired help by John Hadwen. Years later his granddaughter, Mrs. Kyle along with her husband, added the second level. The second structure was the Hadwen homestead, was not visible from the road like the other structures in the village, but instead located at the end of a long driveway.

CONTEXTUAL VALUE:

The structure located at 10967 Jane Street is, historically, visually, and physically linked to the area. The significance of the structure also stems from being a remnant of the historic Village of Teston, which was previously known as Thanessville. The structure is located close to the road and on the east side of Jane Street, like many of the structures in the area.
