Active Transportation 2023 ACCOMPLISHMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Vaughan is home to a large active transportation network of sidewalks, cycle tracks, multi-use pathways and recreational trails - and it continues to grow. As the city evolves, so does our commitment to awareness and culture, safety, infrastructure and connectivity by expanding this network to provide residents with a range of active transportation options, accommodate micromobility users and create an even more interconnected city.

Looking back at 2023

In 2023, more than 11 kilometres of new cycle tracks and multi-use pathways were opened. An additional 29 kilometres of existing multi-use pathways and trails were updated with new pavement markings and signage.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

Weston Road Sidewalk and Cycle Tracks

• 2 kilometres of new cycle tracks and sidewalks were added on each side of Weston Road, between Teston Road and Major Mackenzie Drive.

Martin Grove Cycle Tracks

• 1.7 kilometres of new cycle tracks were added to each side of Martin Grove Road, from Steeles Avenue to the Rainbow Creek Park Trail.

North Maple Regional Park Gateway -Keele Street In-boulevard Multi-use Pathway Project

• 2 kilometres of multi-use pathways were added to the east side of Keele Street, between Teston Road and Kirby Road, providing active transportation connectivity to North Maple Regional Park.

Existing in-boulevard multi-use pathway and trail pavement markings and signage

• 29 kilometres of existing in-boulevard multi-use pathways and trails across the city were updated with pavement markings and signage.

Looking forward to 2024

This year, residents and visitors will see the construction of even more cycle tracks, multi-use pathways and sidewalks.

PROJECTS HIGHLIGHTS:

Jane Street Uptown Link

• 8 kilometres of new cycle tracks and 4 kilometres of new sidewalks and streetlight enhancements are coming to Jane Street, from Highway 7 to Teston Road.

> • The addition of these cycle tracks and sidewalks will provide residents with connections to the Vaughan Metropolitan Centre, Vaughan Mills, Canada's Wonderland and more than 500 businesses along Jane Street.

New Westminster Drive Road

Rehabilitation and Improvements

• 2 kilometres of new cycle tracks on both sides of New Westminster Drive, between Clark Avenue and Bathurst Street, and a new pedestrian crossover at St. Elizabeth Catholic High School are underway.


YORK REGION PROJECTS

Rutherford Road Sidewalk and Cycle Tracks

- 5.4 kilometres of new cycle tracks are currently being added to both sides of Rutherford Road.
- **3.7 kilometres** of new sidewalks are being added to Rutherford Road, from Jane Street to Westburne Drive, and from Peter Rupert Avenue to Bathurst Street.
- These new cycle tracks and sidewalks will provide residents with further connections to the Rutherford GO Station and the recently installed multi-use pathways in the area.

Teston Road Sidewalk and Cycle Tracks

• 2 kilometres of new cycle tracks and sidewalks are being constructed along Teston Road, between Pine Valley Drive and Weston Road, as part of York Region's Teston Road Widening and Reconstruction Project.
