Attachment 3- Explanation of Maps for 10090 Huntington Rd.

	<p>1851 James Wreggitt died in 1850, leaving his property to his two sons, George and Richard.</p> <p>It has been observed in a handful of documents, that the last name 'Wreggitt' was found to be misspelled/misinterpreted from its original spelling.</p> <p>For example, we see the spelling 'Pickett' in the 1851 map of Vaughan.</p> <p>Dalziel (below Wreggitt property) seems to be taking care of the other portion of the Wreggitt property until Richard decides to sell.</p>
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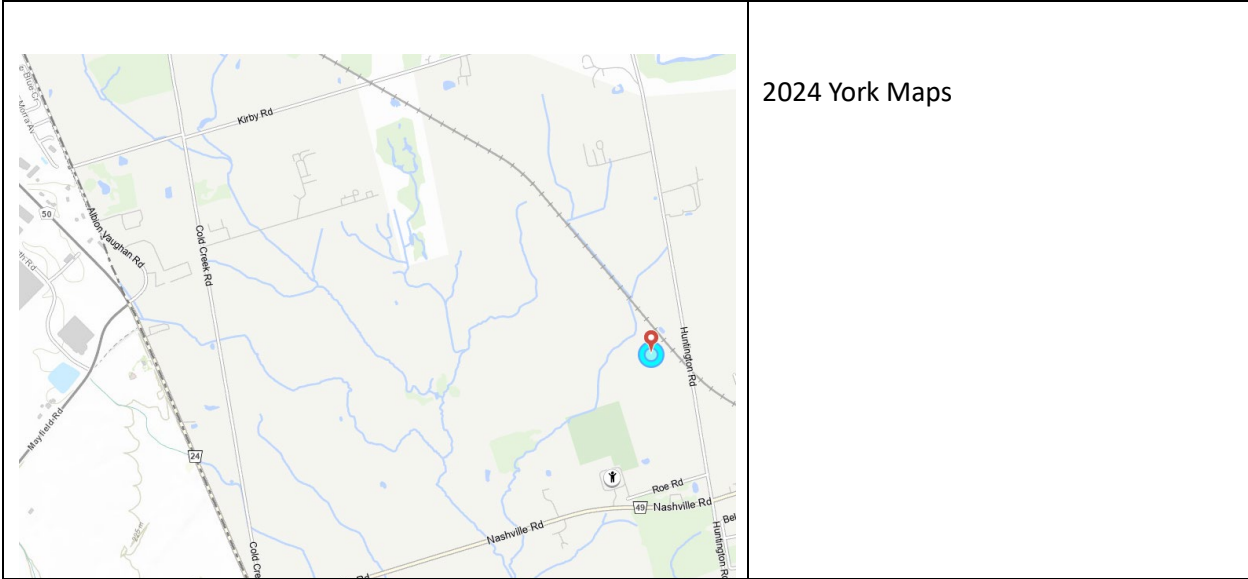
	<p>1860 'Estate of Late James Wreggit' (another misspell) is listed on the Tremaine Map of 1860. It is unclear why George and Richard's names are not listed instead, especially since Tax Assessment records indicate that George was still active on his property.</p>
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	<p>1878 The Tremaine map of 1878 shows John Culham Kurtz as the property owner for Lot 27 Con 10. Although, he had purchased and registered the south half of the property in 1876 from Richard Wreggitt, so it is unusual that his name isn't covering the full 100 acres on the map.</p>
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	<p>1918 E.W. Irwin purchased the property from Edwin James Kurtz in 1907. Notice that now the full 100 acres is accounted for.</p>
