Re: Proposed Changes to Existing City Digital Signs at Community Centres

To the Mayor and City Councillors,

I am writing to express Pattison Outdoor's interest in competing for an opportunity to operate and / or replace existing City Digital Signs, which are currently located at Community Centres throughout the City of Vaughan. These signs are operated by RCC Media, and display City-related messaging.

At the Committee of the Whole meeting on December 12, 2023, Council directed Staff to re-negotiate the current agreement with RCC Media to update and monetize the existing City Digital Signs. Staff were directed to report back in Q2 2024.

Pattison Outdoor recognizes this opportunity to upgrade and monetize the existing City Digital Signs by replacing them with Third Party Digital Billboards. We also believe that the best opportunity for the City to maximize the non-tax revenue generated by these signs is to allow other Sign Operators to participate in this opportunity through a standard RFP Process.

In 2020, Pattison Outdoor was selected as the City's preferred partner to build and operate three Digital Billboards on City-owned lands as part of Phase 1 of the City's Digital Billboard Program. In the past four years, our team has worked closely with Staff to deliver a successful start to this partnership.

We can also ensure that the design of the new City Digital Signs complements the Phase 1 Digital Billboard network, and that community messaging remains at the forefront of this project by allocating sufficient space on each sign to ensure the City's communication objectives are achieved.

By not allowing other Sign Operators to participate in this opportunity, the revenue potential for the City of Vaughan will be unnecessarily limited.

Therefore, we kindly request that Council direct Staff to create a Request For Proposal process for the replacement and monetization of these existing City Digital Signs, as Phase 3 of the City's Digital Billboard Program.



Our request supports Pattison's desire to grow and expand our partnership with the City of Vaughan. We strongly believe that, as Canada's leader in the Digital Out-of-Home market, we can provide the City with all of the elements necessary to make this opportunity a resounding success for all stakeholders.

As always, we are available to participate in further discussions on this matter, and we kindly thank Council for its consideration of our request.

Hate and racism in Canada is all of our problem, not just a Jewish issue, and we should all stand up against this crisis of antisemitism.

To the members of council and the city clerk:

I am a family doctor from Vaughan, and I would like to send my strong support for this proposed bylaw which is essential for protecting our community.

I would call attention to one important gap, which is revealed in <u>this linked video</u>, in which community members are harassed and intimidated *outside their own homes*.

The current list of vulnerable social infrastructure includes "a Childcare Centre, a Congregate Care Facility, a Hospital, a School, or a Place of Worship." This leaves open the opportunity to bring nuisance protests straight into residential areas, a tactic already being used as seen in the video.

A person's dwelling is in fact the *most* vulnerable social infrastructure, because a home should be the point of maximum safety for families and community members. Imagine your children could not leave the house because hateful protests aiming to intimidate them and their family were allowed to proceed outside the front door?

For this reason, I would add *residential areas* to the bill somehow. I do not have the legal expertise to know how to put this in. But I do believe it must be added and that we are going to see this tactic used more and more if it is not.

Here's the note:

"I have actually sent a letter of appreciation after this news regarding a proposed bylaw preventing demonstrators from occupying private property etc. came out.

But I'd like to comment on the notion that although the new bylaw (or proposed) is helpful, it's actually not needed. All the police need to do is to enforce Municipal, Provincial and Federal laws that are already on the books, but they're not doing their job. Why not? Why are demonstrators allowed to trespass on private property (illegal), to wear face coverings at demonstrations (illegal), cause mayhem and disturb the peace (illegal), utter death threats (illegal), call for violence against a specific group (illegal) and the best, assault police officers (highly illegal and something I'd not recommend anyone even think of trying!) without being arrested summarily?

I truly appreciate your intentions and as I'd mentioned in the email I sent in recognition of the proposed new bylaw, I'll take anything I can get. I wrote an email to Mayor Del Duca's office about the rise in antisemitism in Vaughan and its relationship to the protests. In my response, I was told that I could submit feedback on a proposed by-law aimed at protecting Vaughan's places of worship, schools, childcare facilities, and hospital from protests that intimidate, or incite hatred, intolerance, and violence, which will be presented to City Council at the Committee of the Whole meeting scheduled for June 18th, 2024. The following is my written communication, which I would like to submit.

Greetings,

I appreciate being given the chance to comment on the proposed Safe Access Bylaw. As a resident of Thornhill and a member of the Jewish community, I am writing to express my strong support for this initiative, which is crucial for enhancing community safety by legally restricting protests within 100 meters of sensitive areas like places of worship, schools, childcare facilities, and hospitals in Vaughan. This bylaw aims to establish a protective buffer zone around these vulnerable community spaces. Such measures are vital to ensure that these areas remain safe havens, free from disruptions that could incite hatred, intolerance, and violence.

In addition, I am particularly concerned with the safety of neighbourhoods that are predominantly Jewish. Recent incidents where these communities

have been specifically targeted by protestors entering residential areas to intimidate and harass residents with antisemitic rhetoric highlight the need for extending similar protections to these neighbourhoods. It is imperative that provisions to prohibit such protests near private residences are also incorporated into the bylaw to protect residents from targeted antisemitic harassment and ensure their security at home.

Recent attacks on synagogues and other Jewish institutions, including shootings and firebombings, underscore the urgent need for robust protective measures. The rise of such violent acts against our community facilities has heightened the sense of vulnerability among us and further emphasizes the necessity for this bylaw. The threats and intimidation against the Jewish community must stop.

Although this proposed bylaw is a good first step, much more work remains to combat this trend.

THE CITY OF VAUGHAN **BY-LAW**

BY-LAW NUMBER XXX-2024

A By-law to prohibit Nuisance Demonstrations within one hundred metres of Vulnerable Social Infrastructure.

WHEREAS section 8(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* S.O. 2001, c. 25 ("*Municipal Act*") provides that the powers of a municipality under the statute be interpreted broadly so as to confer broad authority on municipalities to enable municipalities to govern their affairs, as they consider appropriate, and enhance their ability to respond to municipal issues;

AND WHEREAS section 11(2)6. of the *Municipal Act* provides for a municipality to pass by-laws respecting the health, safety and well-being of *Persons*;

AND WHEREAS section 35 of the *Municipal Act* provides that a municipality may pass by-laws removing or restricting the common law right of passage by the public over a highway and the common law right of access to the highway;

AND WHEREAS section 102.1 of the *Municipal Act* provides that a municipality may require a person to pay an Administrative Monetary Penalty if the municipality is satisfied that the person has failed to comply with any by-laws respecting the parking, standing or stopping of vehicles;

AND WHEREAS section 128(1) of the *Municipal Act* provides that a municipality may prohibit and regulate with respect to public nuisances, including matters that, in the opinion of council, are or could become or cause public nuisances;

AND WHEREAS section 128(2) of the *Municipal Act* provides that the opinion of council under section 128(1), if arrived at in good faith, is not subject to review by any court;

AND WHEREAS section 426 of the *Municipal Act* provides that no person shall hinder or obstruct, or attempt to hinder or obstruct, any person who is exercising a power or performing a duty under a by-law passed under the *Municipal Act*;

AND WHEREAS section 429 of the *Municipal Act* provides for a municipality to establish a system of fines for offences under a by-law of the municipality passed under the *Municipal Act*;

AND WHEREAS section 434.1 of the *Municipal Act* provides that a municipality may require a person to pay an Administrative Monetary Penalty if the municipality is satisfied that the person has failed to comply with a by-law of the municipality passed under the *Municipal Act*;

AND WHEREAS section 444 of the *Municipal Act* provides for a municipality that is satisfied that a contravention of a by-law of the municipality passed under the *Municipal Act* has occurred to make an order requiring the person who contravened the by-law or who caused or permitted the contravention or the owner or occupier of the land on which the contravention occurred to discontinue the contravening activity;

AND WHEREAS Council recognizes the fundamental right of freedom of expression for people to protest and demonstrate peacefully and further recognizes that such expression is an important element of democratic society;

AND WHEREAS Council also recognizes the need to reasonably and responsibly balance such rights against the health, safety and well-being of members of its communities;

AND WHEREAS Council recognizes that behaviours such as intimidation, inciting hatred, violence, intolerance or discrimination may have negative effects on the health, safety and well-being of its citizens;

AND WHEREAS Council deems certain social infrastructure to be especially vulnerable to public *Nuisance Demonstrations*, and further deems it necessary for such social infrastructure to have protection from such *Nuisance Demonstrations* in order to protect the well-being of users of the *Vulnerable Social Infrastructure*;

AND WHEREAS Council, in good faith, and in accordance with section 128 of the *Municipal Act*, has established what constitutes or could become a *Nuisance Demonstration*, as set out hereunder;

AND WHEREAS nothing in this By-law is intended to prevent peaceful protests or demonstrations, including those that occur as part of a labour union strike;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Vaughan ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1.0 Short Title

 This By-law shall be known and cited as the "Protecting Vulnerable Social Infrastructure By-law".

2.0 Applicability and Scope

(1) The provisions of this By-law apply to all properties, or parts thereof, that are located within one hundred (100) metres of *Vulnerable Social Infrastructure*.

3.0 Definition and Interpretation

"**Person**" means a natural individual or any other legal entity, such as a corporation, as required by context;

"Place of Worship" has the same meaning as set out in *City*'s Comprehensive Zoning By-law 1-2021, being one or more buildings used for the gathering of a religious or faith-based organization for spiritual purposes. "School" means a school as defined in the *Education Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. E.2 and its regulations;

"Vulnerable Social Infrastructure" means a Childcare Centre, a Congregate Care Facility, a Hospital, a School, or a Place of Worship.

4.0 Nuisance Demonstrations Prohibited

(1) No *Person* shall organize or participate in a *Nuisance Demonstration* within one hundred (100) metres of the property line of any *Vulnerable Social*

 - (a) a minimum fine shall not be less than \$500 and a maximum fine shall not exceed \$100,000;

monetary penalty on each subsequent day in which the offence continues.

- (5) For greater clarity, the refusal to provide identification when requested to do so by an *Enforcement Officer* is considered obstruction, in accordance with section 426 of the *Municipal Act*, and is an offence under section 7.0(4) of this By-law.
- (6) If an Order has been issued under this By-law and the Order has not been complied with, the contravention of such Order shall be deemed to be a continuing offence for each day, or part of a day, that the Order is not complied with, and the Person shall be subject to a penalty of \$1,500 for each day or part of a day the offence continues.
- (7) A *Person* who is issued an administrative monetary penalty shall be subject to the procedures provided for in the *Administrative Monetary Penalties By-law*, including the right to request a review of the matter in accordance with the provisions of that By-law.

8.0 Cost Recovery and Unpaid Fines and Penalties

(1) The *City's* Treasurer may add any unpaid fine or administrative monetary penalty to the tax roll for any property in the *City* of which all of the owners are responsible for paying a fine or administrative monetary penalty, and may collect it in the same manner as municipal taxes.

9.0 Severability

(1) Where a court of competent jurisdiction declares any provision of this By-law to be invalid, or to be not in force, or without effect, it is the intention of the Council in enacting this By-law that the remainder of this By-law shall continue to be in force and applied and enforced in accordance with its terms to the fullest extent possible according to law.

10.0 Conflict with Other City By-laws

(1) Where there is a conflict or contradiction between this By-law and any other by-law of the *City*, the provisions establishing the more restrictive standard shall prevail.

11.0 Designated By-law

(1) Schedule 1 of the Administrative Monetary Penalties By-law is hereby amended by including this By-law as a Designated By-law.

12.0 Force and Effect

(1) This By-law shall come into force and effect on the date enacted by Council.

Re: Intention to Designate 6181 Major Mackenzie Drive West *Ontario Heritage Act*

We represent U-Pak Disposals Limited in connection with the above noted property. You issued a notice of intention to designate the property at 6181 Major Mackenzie Drive West pursuant to s. 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*. By letter dated March 26, 2024, our client objected to this intention to designate.

We understand that this matter will be considered by Committee of the Whole on June 18, 2024. We have requested that we be allowed to speak to the matter at that time.

By way of background, this property was significantly impacted by the expropriation of the Major Mackenzie Drive West extension between Highway 27 and Highway 427. As part of this project, the Region of York was required to install a major deep storm sewer through the property on the alignment of a future road known as Finland Drive. The location of Finland Drive is fixed by its intersection with Mayor Mackenzie Drive to the north and old Mayor Mackenzie Drive to the south.

The property intended to be designated as a heritage property is partially located on the Finland Drive right of way, which is owned by the Region. As such, the proposed designation affects both U-Pak and the Region. Once development proceeds on these lands, Finland Drive will become a municipal roadway under the jurisdiction of the City of Vaughan.

It is therefore preferable that the City does not proceed with the designation and allow for the demolition of the structure. Even, if the City does agree to designate the structure, it is clear that it will require relocation, a costly process that may not be warranted by the reasons for the designation.

U-Pak has commissioned a Cultural Heritage Assessment by ATA Architects Inc. dated May 2024. The report at page 87 describes the building in 4 sections from A to D. Only Section A holds any architectural significance, due to its connection with the original McGillivray family.

U-Pak has also commissioned a Structural Condition Assessment report dated May 28, 2024. This report confirms that only Section 1A is worthy of preservation, but would have to be relocated. The report notes (at page 9) that the relocation of masonry buildings is complex and costly, requiring extensive preparatory work. Moreover, a suitable location would have to be found.

Although U-Pak is fully supportive of all efforts by Vaughan to preserve historical buildings, the practical circumstances in this case do not support a designation of any part of the building for the following reasons:

- 1. The construction of the new Major Mackenzie Drive and the acquisition by the Region of York of Finland Drive for the construction of a deep storm sewer rendered this building obsolete in its present location.
- 2. The building is partially located on a future Vaughan municipal roadway.
- 3. Finland Drive is fixed and cannot be realigned.
- 4. Most of the building has no historical significance.
- 5. There is no suitable site for the relocation of the front section, which would also require extensive renovation if detached from the rest of the building.
- 6. The cost of relocation is prohibitive, and would have to be borne by the taxpayers of York Region.

It is suggested that during the demolition process, any significant heritage features could be preserved and incorporated into other structures. We would therefore respectfully request that the City not designate this structure under the Ontario Heritage Act.

- 2. The Structural Condition Assessment Report dated May 28, 2024.
- 3. Two plans of Finland Drive showing the location of the storm sewer and the structure proposed for demolition.

The proximity of this event to not only a house of the worship, but also two daycare facilities and a Jewish day school is understandably cause for significant concern and disturbance within the local community. While we respect the fundamental rights to freedom of speech and expression, it is imperative that the City employ all available measures to ensure strict adherence to all applicable bylaws and regulations.

It is imperative that our law enforcement agencies and politicians fulfill their responsibilities to protect the citizens in an equal and just manner. By allowing these hate-filled demonstrations to continue unchecked, we are giving in to intimidation tactics and holding our entire cities subjected to the whims of violent protestors.

It is time for our politicians and police to step up and do what is necessary to ensure the safety and security of all citizens. We cannot allow bullying and intimidation tactics to dictate the course of our society. It is only through firm and decisive action that we can uphold the principles of justice and equality that our nation was founded upon.

Specifically, we would request the following courses of action:

Parking Enforcement: Implement a highly visible enforcement operation, with ample tow trucks and by-law officers, to monitor parking at the Garnet A. Williams Community Centre, Sobeys Plaza, and the apartment building lot adjacent to the synagogue. Any individuals found parking in these lots without legitimate business should have their vehicles tagged and towed promptly. This will inherently limit attendance.

Street Parking Restrictions: Enforce parking prohibitions on city streets unless direct access to an adjacent property is required.

Cost Recovery: Seek reimbursement from the demonstration organizers for all supplemental security and enforcement costs incurred by the City.

Hate Speech Enforcement: Ensure equal application and enforcement of all relevant laws, including those prohibiting hate speech and vilification. The alleged anti-Semitic slurs directed at counter-protestors during last Sunday's event are unacceptable and must be investigated and prosecuted where warranted.

It is our understanding that York Regional Police were regrettably unresponsive to complaints raised during the previous demonstration. We trust measures will be taken to guarantee this does not reoccur, as preserving public trust in law enforcement authorities is paramount.

A highly visible presence of not only police but also local elected officials in attendance would send a powerful message that such hatred and divisiveness have no place in our community. We look forward to your prompt action to ensure the safety and well-being of all residents in the affected area.

We cannot allow ourselves to be manipulated into believing that tolerating hate expressions will somehow quell the violence. On the contrary, it only emboldens those who seek to disrupt the peace and violate the laws of our society.

While I understand and respect the importance of free speech and the right to demonstrate peacefully, I am alarmed by the growing anti-Semitism and criminal behaviour evident at these events.

The protests, originally intended to express solidarity with Palestine, have unfortunately taken an anti-Semitic turn, featuring vandalism, threatening language, and intimidation, particularly against Jewish individuals and communities. This level of hateful public discourse is not only disturbing but also dangerous, as it fosters a climate of fear and hostility.

I believe this rhetoric crosses the line into incitement to violence against Jews, and it is disheartening to see the lax response of law enforcement to such serious issues. I drove by the protest in your riding which took place on Sunday March 3, which is a few minutes away from my neighbourhood in Thornhill on Clarke, in front of the Reena Foundation for people with developmental disabilities, where I volunteer once a week. I did this to see the protests for myself, as I refuse to be intimidated by them. I have seen the vile antisemitic rhetoric from clips on social media that took place at the protests as

well. There has since been an even bigger, boisterous and violent protest Thursday March 7. The protestors were on residential property, committing assault, and involved in other illegal acts. This was not a peaceful protest. All of this is o social media. You can see who is committing the crimes and did not face arrests.

I would like to believe that composing this email would resolve all issues, but unfortunately, it will not. The situation is getting worse and not improving and is deteriorating rapidly. Members of the Jewish community no longer feel safe and indeed are not safe in Thornhill. Please understand that the strategies currently employed to ensure the safety of the Jewish community are not effective. It is crucial that current approaches be thoroughly reevaluated and revised.

As a concerned citizen who voted for you, these protests must stop.

Mayor Steven Del Duca you and law enforcement must do more to protect Jews from violence and hate.

Thank you for your time and consideration. I look forward to hearing your perspective on this critical issue and the steps you plan to take to address these concerns.

Anti-Israel Demonstrators Encroach on Jewish Community Institutions

In the aftermath of the October 7 Hamas atrocities, anti-Israel demonstrators in Canada have repeatedly taken to the streets, malls and government buildings to spew hateful rhetoric demonizing the Jewish state and people. They've been anything but bashful in advocating the destruction of Israel, whether it be in strident, inflammatory calls for an intifada or "From the river to the sea" chants. But their actions this past week represent an alarming new development with serious potential ramifications for the Jewish community and Canadian society at large.

It began on Sunday in the suburb of Thornhill north of Toronto when dozens of demonstrators gathered outside the Aish Thornhill Community Shul, where a presentation on Israeli real estate was being held. While waving Palestinian flags and holding signs proclaiming "Danger due to Zionism"

and "Israel is a terrorist state," they chanted "Intifada revolution" and "Palestine is not for sale." Similar events took place outside the nearby BAYT synagogue, first with a small demonstration on Wednesday, which included an individual harassing the rabbi and a banner declaring "synagogues complicit in Palestinian ethnic cleansing." That was followed by a large demonstration outside the same synagogue yesterday, during which anti-Israel protesters chanted for intifada and "Zionism is terrorism," among many other chants. It was met with a large police presence, standing in between the protesters and counter-protesters.

Montreal was also the site of several hateful demonstrations this week. Outside the building that houses Federation CJA and the Montreal Holocaust Museum, protesters aggressively harassed Jewish community members, preventing them from entering or exiting the building while chanting, "Settlers, settlers, go back home, Palestine is our home... Palestine is ours alone." Even more vile was the antisemitic rhetoric spewed at a group of Jews outside a synagogue in Montreal. "You only know how to steal," "Just like in the past, you guys can't make it past 80 years" and, translated from Arabic to English, "We don't want to see a single Zionist" are just some of the hate-fueled words used to delegitimize the state of Israel, demonize the Jewish people and threaten the Jewish community.

Protesters marauding around Jewish neighbourhoods, flags and bullhorns in hands, screaming for the destruction of Israel, was a jarring image for the community and a wake-up call for how bad things are getting. It also suggests an escalation of tactics among anti-Israel demonstrators who clearly have no compunction about bringing their hateful antics to our neighbourhoods.

Friends of Simon Wiesenthal Center is working actively with other community organizations to demand safe access zones around Jewish institutions, including synagogues, schools and community centres, to prohibit such displays of hate and intimidation. This follows an injunction placed on anti-Israel protesters in Montreal following this past week's events, declaring a temporary ban on protests within 50 metres of several Jewish institutions. We are currently engaged with law enforcement and government officials, calling on them to take action that will protect all places of worship and community institutions - Jewish, Christian and Muslim alike - in Toronto and surrounding areas and to send a strong, unmistakable message that such hateful demonstrations have no place in our communities.

To the City of Vaughan Committee of the Whole:

Good afternoon. My name is Mendy Finkelstein.

I'm a resident of Thornhill, and the Mayor's office has asked me to share my opinion regarding the proposed by-law "to protect Vaughan's vulnerable social infrastructure."

I was given this opportunity because of my letter written to Melissa Lantsman and copied to various representatives of Vaughan. That letter was written in early March in response to the anger which I and many others experienced seeing the anti-Israel, anti-Jewish, pro-Hamas protests directly in front of two synagogues on Clark Ave in Thornhill.

The gist of my letter was that "enough was enough," and what starts out as "free speech" often ends up being hate speech and much more. I discussed weak political leadership, especially at the Federal and Provincial levels, and I specifically referenced the City of Toronto. I wrote that there had to be a line drawn between free speech and hate speech. Moral clarity was needed, but I hadn't seen any.

In that letter, I also alluded to Germany in the 1930s. Letting hate talk go unheeded led to violence and more, and we all know what happened then. What is disturbing the Jewish community is that the political pushback against the protests here and now has seemingly been minimal. We can see with our very own eyes how the Holocaust could have happened when decent people, the majority, did not do enough.

With its large Jewish population, Vaughan is a prime target for hateful protests. As we saw in early March, it has a bullseye aimed right at Bathurst and Clark.

Now, a little about myself. I'm 76 years old. I was born in Toronto, and so was my dad. My mother was born in Montreal. My grandparents were lucky enough to leave Ukraine, Poland, and Germany just after the First World War. For many years, my dad owned a grocery store on Baldwin St. near Mount Sinai Hospital.

<u>Why am I telling you this?</u> Because I am a Canadian, Torontonian, and Vaughanian true blue, and I am also a Jew who believes that as Israel goes, so goes the Jewish people and perhaps so goes the world. I've been lucky. Despite my last name, I can honestly say that I have not experienced anti-Semitism. I went to U of T, played football on the very grounds still occupied by an anti-Israel encampment, got an MBA there and had a successful career in the residential building industry. Within the industry, we often joked that it was the English 1st, then the Jews, and then the Italians and Portuguese who built the amazing city of Toronto and the entire GTA.

The people of Toronto and the mix of citizens from all over the world have made Toronto and its environs the best place in the world to live, raise a family, and succeed...until now. We have all seen what has happened since Oct. 7, 2023. I'm here to say that <u>Vaughan gets it. Thank you for that.</u> Your detailed analysis resulting in this "By-Law to Protect Vaughan's Vulnerable Social Infrastructure" says a great deal about your understanding of the conflict between Israel and Hamas, which, unfortunately, has spilled onto the streets and university campuses around the world.

However, the war in Gaza, let us not forget, started on October 7th with the massacre of some 1,200 innocent people in Israel, mostly Israeli, by Hamas and, yes, by many supporting Gazan citizens. And the taking of some 240 hostages, again mostly Israeli. We have all seen the headlines for these last 8 months. I guarantee that the Jewish community has seen much more than the headlines. And what we've seen is horrifying.

The consequences of this war have certainly appalled (disgusted is a better word) most citizens of Canada, Ontario, and Vaughan. Yes, there is a silent majority with some moral clarity. Where did this overt anti-Semitism start? The Gaza war? Or was it the extensive immigration we've witnessed over the past few years, with many coming from the Middle East and importing their hate of Israel and Jews? Or did it come from the Universities that, for maybe 2 generations, have apparently been feeding students a bunch of lies about Israel and the Jewish People? All political bodies, unions, schools, school boards, Universities and the mostly biased media must take corrective action now, or this will worsen.

<u>Thank you, City of Vaughan, for developing this by-law.</u> It's a step in the right direction and shows leadership where other political bodies have shown little. No hate protests within 100 meters of a sensitive institution is good, but it's only a start. Hate speech is hate speech, and this must be outlawed anywhere.

Let me conclude with this observation:

As some Holocaust survivors and others have said, it starts with hateful words that, if unchecked, will expand to violence, singling out the Jewish Community first.

Let's look closely at what has been happening in our backyard: "From the river to the sea, Palestine will be free," they chant. This means the extermination of Israel and the elimination of the Jewish people from the Middle East. That's a call for genocide of the Jewish people....and no one has said "boo." The firebombing of a Jewish deli and a synagogue. The spray painting at Jewishowned Indigo. Shooting into a Jewish school on an early Saturday morning. A mayor who doesn't show up for an Israeli flag raising at Toronto City Hall on Israel's Independence Day, hate protests in Jewish neighbourhoods, police giving coffee to the protesters, and, of course, the now over a month-long anti-Israel, anti-Jewish encampment at the University of Toronto with a University administration apparently incapable of dealing with this.

Without detailing the specific wording on the banners and signage, essentially, the protests have morphed from being pro-Palestinian, pro-Hamas into outright and unapologetic "wipe Israel off the map and kill the Jews."

If this blatant anti-Semitism is left unchecked, the worst is yet to come. We need look no further than the Manhattan Subway system last week: a bunch of pro-Hamas, anti-Jewish haters dressed in Hamas-like garb and wearing their standard masks stormed onto many subway cars. They shouted: "Are there any Jews here? Are there any Zionists here? Now's your chance to get off". Silence on the subway cars. A leader shouts: "Good, there are no Jews here."

What happens in the US surely moves north, with the pro-Hamas mobs of Montreal, Toronto, and Vancouver being enthusiastic copycats.

So, I say to The Vaughan Committee of the Whole---Thank you for showing strong municipal leadership by introducing and hopefully approving this By-Law to Protect Vaughan's Vulnerable Social Infrastructure. Protests within 100m of sensitive places are a start, but it's better if hate speech and hateful acts are recognized as such anywhere and prohibited with infractions met with substantial and actionable penalties.

Dear Mayor Del Duca and Members of Vaughan City Council;

I write to you on behalf of concerned members of the Vaughan community, including various religious, cultural, and social groups, to address significant issues surrounding the proposed By-law to Protect Vaughan's Vulnerable Social Infrastructure. While we acknowledge the importance of safeguarding our community members from intimidation, incitement of hatred, violence, intolerance, and discrimination, we believe that the current draft of the By-law requires further scrutiny and inclusive dialogue before being enacted.

In our review of the proposed By-law, we have identified several key areas that warrant careful reconsideration and broader community engagement. These concerns include but are not limited to the following:

1. Lack of Community Consultation:

The proposed By-law has significant implications for the Muslim and Arab communities, among others. It is essential to engage directly with these communities to understand their perspectives and concerns. An inclusive consultation process would help ensure that the By-law does not inadvertently infringe upon the rights and freedoms of any group, and that it effectively addresses the concerns it aims to mitigate.

2. Balancing the Right to Protest:

The right to peaceful protest is a fundamental aspect of democratic society, protected under the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*. While the By-law aims to prevent intimidating and harmful protests, it must also clearly define and protect peaceful assemblies. The current language around what constitutes a "*nuisance demonstration*" could be interpreted broadly, potentially leading to the suppression of legitimate, nonviolent expressions of dissent. Specifically, the term "*reasonable person*" in defining intimidation may be too subjective and could lead to inconsistent enforcement.

3. Enforcement and Penalties

The By-law provides substantial authority to Enforcement Officers, including the ability to issue orders and impose fines or administrative monetary penalties. While this is necessary for maintaining order, there must be clear guidelines to ensure these powers are exercised fairly and justly. The fines, ranging from \$500 to \$100,000, are particularly steep and could disproportionately affect smaller organizations and individuals. Furthermore, the By-law does not provide adequate clarity on the appeal process for penalties, which could leave those accused of violations with limited recourse.

4. Potential Conflict with Labour Rights

The By-law must consider the rights of labour unions to protest and picket, which are protected under labour laws. Picketing and labour protests are vital tools for workers to advocate for their rights and better working conditions. The broad definitions and enforcement powers in the current draft could unintentionally suppress these legitimate labour activities, causing significant conflicts with established labour rights. Clear exemptions or guidelines should be included to ensure that labour protests are not unduly restricted.

5. Specificity of Protected Areas

The By-law defines Vulnerable Social Infrastructure as including Childcare Centres, Congregate Care Facilities, Hospitals, Schools, and Places of Worship. While these are crucial areas to protect, the 100-meter buffer zone might require further discussion. This distance could encompass significant portions of urban areas, potentially impacting a wide range of activities and gatherings not intended to be targeted by this By-law.

6. Protection of Vulnerable Social Infrastructure:

We support measures to protect schools, childcare centers, hospitals, places of worship, and congregate care facilities from disruptive and harmful activities. However, the By-law must delineate specific criteria for what constitutes intimidation and ensure that enforcement measures are proportional and non-discriminatory. We need to avoid creating a legal environment that could be misused to target specific communities or stifle legitimate expressions of concern and advocacy.

In light of the foregoing concerns, we respectfully propose the following steps to ensure that the By-law is both effective and equitable:

1. <u>Postponement of the Decision</u>: We urge the City Council to postpone the final decision on this By-law. This postponement would allow for a comprehensive consultation process involving all affected communities, particularly the Muslim community, which has voiced significant concerns about the potential impacts of the By-law.

2. <u>Establish a Consultation Framework</u>: Form a diverse committee including representatives from religious institutions, cultural groups, legal experts, civil rights organizations, and law enforcement. This committee should be tasked with reviewing the By-law, gathering community feedback, and proposing amendments that balance the need for security with the protection of civil liberties.

3. <u>Define Clear Enforcement Guidelines</u>: Ensure that the By-law includes clear, precise definitions and guidelines for enforcement to prevent misuse. The criteria for what constitutes a "*nuisance demonstration*" should be explicit, focusing on actions that genuinely pose a threat to safety and well-being, without broadly targeting peaceful protests. Additionally, provide clear and accessible information on the appeal process for fines and penalties to ensure transparency and fairness.

The City of Vaughan is a proud, diverse, and inclusive community. It is imperative that any legislation, particularly one as impactful as this By-law, reflects these values and is developed through a transparent, inclusive process. We believe that through constructive dialogue and collaboration, we can create a By-law that effectively protects our vulnerable social infrastructure while upholding the fundamental rights of all Vaughan residents.

We look forward to your positive response and are ready to engage in any discussions necessary to achieve a balanced and fair outcome for our community.

First, thank you to Mayor Del Duca for this member's resolution to protect Vaughan's places of worship, and thank you to every member of council who has put their support behind this resolution.

I fundamentally believe in the right to protest. It is a central tenet of our freedoms as Canadians freedoms that I want to safeguard and protect. There is, however, a difference between the right to protest and the right to intimidate. While everyone should have the right to express their views on a variety of issues, no one should have the right to harass others simply because of their religion, their background, or any other right protected by-law.

That is what we witnessed in Vaughan just a few months ago as one of the largest synagogues in the country, in our community was targeted by the anti-Israel mob. The intention of these protests was clear in their choice of location. There is no Israeli embassy, consulate or government office in Thornhill, and if these belligerent activists really wanted to make an anti-Israel statement, then they would have done so in one of the above stated appropriate locations. Instead, they chose to make an anti-Jewish statement. These protests were explicitly designed to put fear into the hearts of our Jewish neighbours, to chip away at their freedom of religion and expression by targeting one of the biggest Jewish communities in Canada at a place of worship.

As leaders, we must ensure that everyone can worship safely. That everyone can do so without fear. That means synagogues, but it also means mosques, temples, churches, and other places.

I want to stress again that I fully believe and support Canadians' right to protest, even if I strongly disagree with the cause they're protesting. But I do not support Canadians' right to block other Canadians from entering a place of worship, to intimidate their neighbours, and to participate in outright acts hatred. I think this proposed by-law achieves balancing both views - ensuring *both* freedoms of assembly and religion are protected.

I'm pleased to support this motion and I want to thank the city's leadership, the YRP, and everyone else who continues to do the hard work to protect places of worship of all stripes in every corner of the city. This proposal is just one more tool to ensure that safety is protected, and I'd like to thank you the council for what I hope will be its swift adoption.

KLM Planning Partners Inc. is the land use planning consultant representing 716051 Ontario Limited & 1214420 Ontario Limited ("**client**"). Our client owns a series of landholdings at the southeast corner of the intersection of Martin Grove Road and Highway 7, known municipally as 5555, 5585, 5597 and 5601 Highway 7, 7731, 7685,7635,7625 Martin Grove Road, and 211 Woodstream Boulevard in the City of Vaughan (the "**City**"), Region of York (the "**Region**") (the "**Subject Lands**"). A map identifying the location of the Subject Lands is attached herein.

We recently became aware that the above noted report was to be presented to Committee of the Whole on June 18, 2024, seeking input on the establishment of a "Special Area" on certain lands at the intersection of Highway 7 and Martin Grove Road, including the Subject Lands. The intent of the Special Area is to enable staff to request the formation of a landowner group and the submission of a comprehensive Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan amongst all landowners therein pursuant to Section 10.1.1.7 of the City's Official Plan, as part of a complete application for development applications within the area. The staff report notes that the Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan is necessary to provide for coordination among the various development applications and employment conversions within the Special Area, and since the lands are not located within a Primary Centre, Local Centre or a Secondary Plan where a Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan could otherwise be required.

It is our opinion that the submission of a Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan is unnecessary and will not provide any additional information which would otherwise be provided in the other various materials being requested in connection with development applications in this area. The outcome will be a duplication of effort which will only serve to slow down development approvals in the area, adversely affecting the timely approval of new housing units in Vaughan in the middle of a well documented housing crisis. The coordination of development applications and the assessment of each item identified in Section 10.1.1.7 of VOP 2010 is evaluated within supporting studies provided with development applications on a site-specific basis. The requirement to form a landowner group and submit a consolidated report amongst landowners for a relatively small percentage of lands which are likely be redeveloped within the "Special Area" will in our opinion result in unnecessary delays in the approval of development applications.

On this basis we respectfully request that Council reject the recommendation from staff and allow each individual development application to proceed on their own merits.

As identified above, we were recently advised of the above noted report only through a response to email correspondence we sent to planning staff. No separate notice was provided to our client and we are unable to determine if other landowners within the "Special Area" received notice and had the ability to review and comment on the recommendation from planning staff. Given the potential implications of this report, it is our opinion that insufficient notice was provided to all properties affected by the Special Area such that due consideration by each landowner of potential impacts could be completed.

Please consider this our formal request to be properly notified of any future meetings in relation to the proposed "Special Area" at the intersection of Martin Grove Road and Highway 7.

KLM Planning Partners Inc. is the land use planning consultant for Anatolia Capital Corp. ("**client**"). Our client owns lands west of Martin Grove Road, on the north side of Highway 7, known municipally as 5770 Highway 7 in the City of Vaughan (the "**Subject Lands**"). A map identifying the location of the Subject Lands is attached herein.

We only recently became aware of the above noted report that is to be presented to Committee of the Whole on June 18, 2024, seeking input on the establishment of a "Special Area" on certain lands at the intersection of Highway 7 and Martin Grove Road. We note that the proposed boundary of the Special Area excludes the Subject Lands. The stated intent of the Special Area is to enable staff to request the submission of a comprehensive Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan amongst all landowners therein pursuant to Section 10.1.1.7 of the City's Official Plan, as part of a complete application for development applications within the area. The staff report notes that the Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan is necessary to provide for coordination among the various development applications and employment conversions within the Special Area, and since the lands are not located within a Primary Centre, Local Centre or a Secondary Plan where a Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan could otherwise be required.

The Subject Lands are designated "Mid-Rise Mixed Use" with a permission for heights up to 8 storeys and a net density of 2.5 FSI in the City's Official Plan and are therefore intended to be redeveloped to facilitate a mix of uses. Should the Subject Lands not be included within the Special Area and the recommendation in the report approved, our client's may be unnecessarily prejudiced, potentially impacting future development approvals on their land.

While we question the effectiveness of staff's recommendation; our client has an interest in the redevelopment of their lands and therefore should not be excluded from any comprehensive plans for the Martin Grove and Highway 7 area. Should Council adopt Staff's recommendations for a Special Area; it should include my client's lands so that they may participate in any discussions related to the comprehensive planning for the area. Further, my client is engaged in Vaughan's Municipal Comprehensive Review and is participating through that process as well.

It should be noted that my client did not receive Notice of this meeting and have had limited ability to review and comment on the recommendation from planning staff. Weston Consulting is the planning consultant for the 'Highway 7 and Martin Grove Landowner Group ("The Landowners"), the registered owners of the properties located at the southwest quadrant of Highway 7 and Martin Grove Road. These lands are municipally known as 5657, 5731, 5781, 5655 Highway 7 and 7700 and 7714 Martin Grove Road, in the City of Vaughan ('the Subject Lands"). On behalf of the Owner, this letter has been prepared to provide formal acknowledgment of the proposed Martin Grove Road and Highway 7 Special Area and the Landowners' concerns regarding the implications of the planning approach City Staff has recommended for the special area to the future development of the Landowners' land holdings.

Description of the Subject Lands

The Subject Lands are located at the southwest quadrant of the Highway 7 and Martin Grove Road intersection in the community of Woodbridge. Consisting of six parcels, the Subject Lands are approximately 6.96 hectares (17.20 acres) in area with 407 metres of frontage Highway 7 and 132.6 metres along Martin Grove Road. The lands are currently occupied by a variety of single-storey commercial and retail uses. The majority of the Subject Lands are covered by surface parking, with minimal onsite landscaping.

Application History

An Official Plan Amendment Application was submitted on April 29, 2022, to facilitate the development of a highrise mixed-use master plan to permit a phased development of 10 residential apartment blocks totaling 13 buildings varying in height from 12 – 28 storeys with at-grade commercial uses. The proposal included the delivery of a road network, public parks, and privately-owned publicly accessible spaces and a phasing plan to enable efficient land development, creating a complete community. Consistent with the application checklist and submission requirements, several technical reports and studies were submitted to the City, including a Planning Justification Report, Urban Design and Sustainability Brief, Master Functional Servicing Report, Transportation Considerations Report, Community Services and Facilities Study, Landscape Master Plan, Arborist Report, Parks and Open Space Detailed Facility Fit Study, Parkland Dedication Summary, Environmental Noise and Vibration Assessment, Wind Study, Air Quality Assessment, Sun Shadow Study, Hydrogeological and Geotechnical Investigations, Water Balance Assessment, and Phase 1 and 2 Environmental Site Assessments.

A statutory public meeting was held on February 7, 2023, regarding the development proposal and received comments from the Committee of the Whole and the public. A series of extensive and successful public meetings and engagements occurred over several months with stakeholders, including residents, businesses, ratepayers' associations, and Local and Regional Councillors. Comments on the first submission were received from the



York Region, various City departments, and agencies. Since then, the project team has been actively involved with several discussions with Staff to address Council direction, Staff comments, public feedback, and potential modifications to the application and resubmission deliverables. The comments/feedback received through the public/stakeholder consultation meetings were carefully considered and incorporated in the application resubmission to the City on June 3, 2024. The resubmission also responded to the phasing approach discussed with City Staff and included the policy direction and the use of Holding Symbols (H) to align development phasing with the delivery of municipal infrastructure (water, wastewater, stormwater, and transportation), a comprehensive road network and parkland to facilitate the proposed development.

Comments on Martin Grove Road and Highway 7 – Special Area

We have reviewed the Committee of the Whole Report for the June 18, 2024 meeting. The proposed special area is extensive, bounded by Highway 7 to the north, Highway 27 to the west, Kipling Avenue to the east, and the Vaughan Grove turf field to the south. City Staff are requesting a Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan to be coordinated amongst all landowners in this area to address, including but not limited to, the phasing of development, height, and massing of buildings, distribution of land uses and densities, parks system, and pedestrian, bicycle and vehicular circulation. Given the significant progress made on this application, the extent of technical studies prepared and submitted to the City, the extensive public engagement that has occurred, and the Landowners' collective commitment to implementing the master plan development in a phased and logical manner, the Landowners' have significant concerns regarding the proposed land use planning approach for the special area, in particular the requirement for a Landowner Group ("LOG") to submit a joint Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan ("DCRPP") with supporting comprehensive studies, for the entire identified special area.

The development proposal envisions master planning of the Subject Lands. The phasing approach has been carefully crafted and considered for efficient growth and appropriate development of the Subject Lands that aligns with the availability of necessary infrastructure and services and delivery of street networks, public parks, and retail areas to accommodate the needs of the future residents, following the principles of creating a complete community. The holding provisions have been proposed in the draft OPA instrument to allow the future development of the Subject Lands in a coordinated and comprehensive manner when the municipal services and traffic infrastructure are sufficiently available to serve the proposed development.

We believe the Landowners' participation in a LOG to prepare a DCRPP or contribute to the required supporting comprehensive studies will result in unnecessary duplication of efforts and additional costs. This will ultimately delay development approvals and adversely affect the delivery of much-needed housing in the City as directed by the recent Provincial legislation. It is our opinion that the coordination of developments and the building of complete communities can be undertaken through supporting technical studies provided by each landowner on a site-specific basis, through the necessary development application review process, and through the use of holding provisions where appropriate.

We are not supportive of the proposed requirement for a DCRPP with supporting studies and respectfully request the Committee to consider appropriate solutions to advance and expedite planning approval of the Subject Lands. We request to be notified of any new information, future reports, and/or meetings and decisions regarding the proposed special area.

Weston Consulting is the planning consultant for Co-Mart Holdings Limited, the registered owner of the properties municipally known as 20 Roysun Road and 50 Sovereign Court, herein referred to as the "Subject Lands". The purpose of this letter is to provide formal acknowledgement of the proposed Martin Grove Road and Highway 7 Special Area and our concerns regarding this approach as it relates to the future development of our client's land holdings.

Application History and Approvals

The subject lands consist of two parcels that are located on the west side of Martin Grove Road north of Roysun Road. The subject lands consist of a combined 16,023 square metres (approximately 1.6 hectares) and are surrounded by institutional and recreational uses to the east (Woodbridge Sports Dome, Holy Cross Catholic Academy), and a variety of commercial and industrial uses to the north, west and south.

Requests for Employment Lands Conversions were approved by the Committee of the Whole for both 20 Roysun Road and 55 Sovereign Court through the recent York Region Municipal Comprehensive Review process. The purpose of the employment conversions was to permit a broader range of uses, including residential on the subject lands.

In December 2021, applications for an Official Plan Amendment (OP.21.027) and a Zoning By-law Amendment (Z.21.056) were submitted for the lands municipally known as 20 Roysun Road, to facilitate the development of a mid-rise building consisting of two (2) residential towers, 10 and 12 storeys in height, located atop a six (6)-storey podium, comprised of 245 apartment residential dwelling units and ground floor retail commercial uses. The Site Development Application (DA.24.029) was subsequently submitted in April 2024 following the approval of the Official Plan Amendment and Zoning By-law Amendment applications in December 2023. The Site Development application is well along in the review process, and we are currently working to address comments and satisfy the Holding Symbol "(H)" provisions. The intent is that similar applications for mid-rise residential would be planned in a coordinated and comprehensive manner for the lands immediately north, located at 55 Sovereign Court in the future.

Through the York Region MCR process and site-specific development application process, numerous reports and technical studies were undertaken, including but not limited to, a Planning Justification Report, Urban Design Brief, Community Services and Facilities Study, Landscape Master Plan, Air Quality Report, Transportation Mobility Plan and Impact Study, Noise and Vibration Report, Stormwater Management and Functional Servicing



Report, Wind Study, Shadow Study, Hydrogeological and Geotechnical Investigations, and Phase 1 and 2 Environmental Site Assessments.

Comments on Martin Grove Road and Highway 7 - Special Area

We have reviewed the Committee of the Whole Report for the June 18, 2024 meeting, and our client's have significant concerns regarding the proposed land use planning approach for the special area, in particular the requirement for a Landowner Group ("LOG") to submit a joint Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan ("DCRPP") with supporting comprehensive studies, for the entire identified special area.

We provide the following comments for consideration:

- 1. The proposed special area is extensive, bounded by Highway 7 to the north, Highway 27 to the west, Kipling Avenue to the east, and the Vaughan Grove turf field to the south. City Staff are requesting a Development Concept Report and Phasing Plan to be coordinated amongst all landowners/applicants in this area to address, including but not limited to, the phasing of development, height and massing of buildings, distribution of land uses and densities, parks system, and pedestrian, bicycle and vehicular circulation systems. Our client's lands are located at the most southwest portion of the proposed special area, generally within a different context than the properties that are located along the Highway 7 intensification corridor. Through the site-specific development applications, the development proposal has been reviewed on the basis of its own locational attributes, policy and urban design considerations, and planning and technical requirements and merits. The intent is that future applications for mid-rise residential would be planned in a coordinated and comprehensive manner for our client's other land holdings located immediately north of their 20 Roysun Road property, at 55 Sovereign Court, as these are the only two parcels in the most southwest portion of the special area that received an employment conversion and are intended for residential development.
- 2. Given the extent of the technical studies previously prepared in support of our client's proposed development, we do not believe it is necessary or reasonable to expect our client to participate in a LOG, prepare a DCRPP, or contribute to the required supporting comprehensive studies. This recommendation will result in an unnecessary duplication of efforts, additional costs, and will ultimately delay development approvals and adversely affect the delivery of much needed housing in this area through the current planning approvals process.
- 3. It is our opinion that the coordination of developments and building of complete communities can be undertaken through supporting technical studies provided by each landowner on a site-specific basis through the necessary development application review process, and use of holding provisions where appropriate.

The proposed development and associated applications for Official Plan and Zoning By-law Amendment were approved based on technical study and good planning and urban design principles and seek to enhance an underutilized parcel within the City of Vaughan. It is our opinion that the proposed development and associated site development application should continue to proceed through the process as prescribed by the Planning Act.

We are not supportive of the proposed requirement for a DCRPP with supporting studies as it is a redundant process that will unnecessarily delay the development approval process and the supply of housing. Coordination of developments can be undertaken through supporting technical studies provided by each landowner in the special area on a site-specific basis through the necessary development application review process. It is our



opinion that the priority should be to find ways to work together to expedite approvals and housing as mandated by provincial legislation and not delay it.

I am writing to you on behalf of Reena, an organization committed to enhancing the lives of individuals with developmental disabilities through comprehensive support services. Our mission at Reena is to ensure the wellbeing and quality of life for all members of our community, which is why we are reaching out to express our strong support for the recent by-law proposed in Vaughan.

Reena provides a range of vital services, including residential support, respite programs, Community Participation, Summer Camps, and advocacy. These services are crucial for the individuals we support, many of whom rely on the safety of our facilities to thrive.

The by-law proposes to prohibit demonstrations within 100 meters of places of worship, congregate care settings, schools, child-care centres, and hospitals, and is a significant step forward in protecting our community's vulnerable social infrastructure from protests that may incite hatred, intolerance, and violence.

For the individuals supported by Reena, this by-law ensures that their access to our services remains uninterrupted and free from the distress that can be caused by demonstrations near our facilities. It also reinforces the sense of security and peace that is essential for their well-being. It is essential that congregate care settings be included in the definition in the by-law to protect the most vulnerable from being targets of intentional disruption and psychological harm.

In March 2024, Reena witnessed first-hand how demonstrations, even when lawful, can inadvertently create an atmosphere of intimidation and fear. Such an environment is detrimental to the mental health of the individuals we serve, many of whom are particularly sensitive to loud noises and large, unpredictable crowds.

Dear Mayor Del Duca and Members of Vaughan City Council:

On behalf of 180,000 OPSEU/SEFPO members, I write today to voice strong opposition to the "Protecting Vulnerable Social Infrastructure By law" that is coming before you today. Please do not fall for the rhetoric that this bylaw is about protecting vulnerable communities. Canada already has legislation in place that addresses community safety, hate speech and violence; that is not what is being discussed here. What is at stake here is simply the right to voice dissenting opinions within reach of certain locations.

OPSEU/SEFPO members work at a number of such locations and our right to gather and express ourselves there – perhaps especially when as workers, we want our voices to be heard, whether it is during a strike or whether it is when we are taking political action – is a fundamental right that we have been guaranteed through multiple legal challenges that have been heard at the Supreme Court of Canada. Calling it a "protest" does not change the essential nature of these activities.

Bylaws such as these seek to restrict broad rights based on narrow or temporary circumstances that some Councillors or their constituents do not like. A \$100,000 fine for the violation of such a by-law lays bare the draconian intent to stifle free expression that underlies bylaws and motions like this, which do indeed attempt to set aside Charter-protected rights to freedom of assembly and expression. But the reason these protections exist in a democracy in the first place is precisely so that speech or activities that are not popular do not get restricted.

As Councillors, I ask you to remember that there are many residents in your communities who hold many and diverse views. Your primary task should be ensuring that you hear from as many voices as possible so that you have all the information you need to make the best decisions possible for all of the people who call Vaughan home, not to try to restrict the voices you hear to those who agree with you.

On behalf of OPSEU/SEFPO, I urge you all to vote against this proposed Bylaw and put an end to the notion that "protest" can or should be restricted. In a free and democratic society, peaceful protest that respects human rights and differences actually make for stronger communities.

Introduction

- Independent Jewish Voices' York Region chapter represents progressive Jewish community members in Vaughan and across York Region.
- Anti-semitism and anti-Palestinian racism are both serious problems that must be addressed. One isn't more or less important than the other.
- We believe we all must fight these forms of discrimination together. We want our government to facilitate dialogue and collaboration – not suspicion, suppression and division.



Why do progressive Jews reject this proposed by-law?



1. This bylaw would **not** increase safety.

- The Vaughan staff report on the proposed by-law provides examples of alleged hate crimes.
- Not a single one of the examples cited (arson, bomb threats, vandalism, shooting at buildings) would have been prevented by the proposed bylaw. There is zero evidence of any connection between peaceful protests and such acts.
- Vaughan must focus on investigating and addressing acts of violence instead of offering a false solution that a) won't prevent hate crimes and b) will permanently reduce the entire Vaughan community's democratic rights and freedoms.



2. We need to rule on **facts**, not feelings.

- As written, the bylaw would kick in if a community member merely feels "intimidated" or "concerned" for their safety or security - even if there's no actual threat whatsoever.
- This is a **shockingly low bar** for stripping others of their democratic right to peaceful protest, calling in armed police to physically suppress them, and fining them up to \$100,000!
- As adults, we all know that **feelings are not facts.** It is extremely dangerous to legislate away anything that merely feels scary to some. Our laws and especially our punishments must be grounded in **facts,** not subjective emotions.



3. The protests have been legitimate.

- This by-law was proposed in the wake of peaceful protests that took place in Thornhill.
- The peaceful protests were held outside synagogues while they hosted non-religious real estate events selling land in Israel-Palestine that is under serious dispute.
- Other venues in Vaughan chose **not** to host the sale specifically because they felt it would be problematic.
- As progressive Jews, we support the community's right to peacefully protest such an event, wherever it may be hosted.

What do we want instead?

- Initiatives that bring Vaughan minorities **together** to solve problems collaboratively
- Solutions that address actual violence and hate crimes, instead of subjective feelings
- Solutions that do **not** reduce the entire Vaughan community's democratic rights and freedoms







"A heritage property does not need to be in original condition. Few survive without alterations on the long journey between their date of origin and today. Integrity is a question of whether the surviving physical features (heritage attributes) continue to represent or support the cultural heritage value or interest of the property.


