
Age-Friendly Report Card

- ► The Age-Friendly Community Action plan was developed as a 10-year vision for Vaughan in 2022.
- Comprised of 28 action items and priorities to help make Vaughan more age-friendly.
- Action items range from long-term, systemic changes and advocacy work to short-term events and initiatives
- ► The 2024 Report Card is the first check in on our progress.






Age-Friendly Action Item by Pillar



Age-Friendly Action Item Status



- ➤ Actively Ongoing: These items are ongoing and do not have a specific end date as they are continual.
- ▶ Completed: These items are complete within 2023 and 2024.
- Progressing as Anticipated: These items are on track to deliver results.
- ▶ Upcoming: Resources will be dedicated to these items in upcoming year.

Highlights from 2023-2024



Completed Items (5)

Action item 3. Continue to make improvements to street lighting, pedestrian crossings and signal times, and overall community safety.

- The City has implemented several initiatives under MoveSmart, including:
 - Installing and piloting traffic calming measures, such as enhanced radar message boards, temporary speed humps, planters and curb extensions at select locations across the city
 - Setting and adjusting appropriate speed limits and installing new signage
 - Completing neighbourhood traffic and speed management studies





Completed Items (5)

Action item 9. Explore opportunities to provide a needs-based transit subsidy.

- Introduction of the One Fare program to assist with the costs of trip-chaining across regions
- Pricing for seniors on YRT is reduced and there are additional subsidy opportunities for low-income pre-senior individuals.





Completed Items (5) cont.

Action item 28. Work with community organizations to coordinate monthly 'Coffee Connections'.

- Coffee Connections will provide educational workshops and social experiences for approx. 500 Vaughan seniors over the 12 sessions.
- Sessions are consistently full with waitlists for the program.
- Topics include, Fire Safety, Wills and Estate Planning, Healthy Aging, Emergency Preparedness, Crime Prevention and more.






Actively Ongoing Items (11)

Action item 2. Continue to ensure that park and open space design incorporate spaces and amenities that are accessible and encourage physical activity, wellness, and recreational opportunities for all ages.

The Greenspace Strategic Plan has the needs of seniors integrated into City policy through various workshops and consultations.





Actively Ongoing Items (11)

Action item 15. Work with community partners to increase awareness and share resources to combat ageism and elder abuse.

Recreation Services staff conducted lunch and learn sessions at four community centres with York Regional Police and Vaughan Fire and Rescue in 2023. Over 340 people attended the four sessions.





City staff have met with various stakeholders to assess the feasibility of a hub in Vaughan. Work will continue in 2025.





Upcoming Items (6)

- Action item 1. Continue to explore opportunities to expand winter snow removal program for seniors.
- Action item 10. In support of the City's Affordable Housing Strategy, establish policies, and identify opportunities, to provide a range of housing forms that meet the diverse and changing needs of residents.
- Action item 11. Explore opportunities for community partnerships to pilot a Home Share program in Vaughan.
- Action item 12. Share information and promote funding options for home adaptation, repair, and modification programs.
- Action item 13. Support community partners in efforts to promote and increase in-home supports for seniors and people with disabilities.
- Action item 25. Develop relationship with the Western York Region Ontario Health Team to further advocate for health services in Vaughan.
