BY-LAW NUMBER 111-2025

A By-law to amend By-law 144-2018 to delegate administrative authority to staff regarding agreements related to student partnerships and internships.

WHEREAS subsection 5(3) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended (hereinafter the “Municipal Act”), provides that a municipal power shall be exercised by by-law;

AND WHEREAS section 23.1(1) of the Municipal Act, authorizes a municipality to delegate administrative powers and duties subject to certain restrictions;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Vaughan enacted By-law 144-2018 on June 19, 2018 to delegate authority regarding certain matters to staff to improve daily business efficiencies;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Vaughan recognized the need to further delegate authority to staff as contained herein and amend By-law 144-2018;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Vaughan ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT Schedule “A” of By-law 144-2018 be hereby amended to add the delegation of powers and duties as set out in Schedule “A” to this By-law.
