I live just south of Steeles Ave, and therefore I am not on your voting rolls, but I shop regularly in Thornhill, including stores on Steeles Ave. I, and very many other local residents will be extremely negatively impacted by the mega development that is proposed along Steeles Ave., between Hilda and Yonge. As it is now, traffic on Hilda going south in the morning and going north at rush hour in the afternoon is restricted, and this puts an additional strain on the already overburdened north-south traffic on Bathurst and Yonge.
