





Findings – Risks for Isolation

- 5,395 seniors or 22.1% of seniors in Vaughan live alone
- · 7,790 seniors in Vaughan or 18.7% of seniors cannot speak English
- National statistics show that 12% of Canadians age 65 and older feel socially isolated

Findings – Labour Force

Findings – Housing Types

- 63% of Vaughan's seniors live in single-detached homes
- 23% live in apartment buildings
- 6% live in townhomes
- 5% in semi-detached homes
- 3% in secondary suites

Findings – Housing Affordability

- 6,710 senior led households (or 27.6% of seniors) spend more than 30% of income on shelter costs
- 2,090 senior led households (or 8.6% of seniors) spend more than
 50% of their income on shelter costs
- 4,295 senior households (17.6%) are in core housing need
- 45% of senior renter households are in core housing need

Findings – Sense of Community


- 71.2% of York Region seniors report a somewhat strong or very strong sense of belonging to the local community.
- Almost 90% report their life satisfaction as satisfied or very satisfied.

Findings – Health

- 26.4% of York Region seniors perceived their health to be fair or poor.
- 30.9% of seniors in York Region have activity limitations.
- 16.2% of York Region seniors are obese.
- 52.2% of seniors in York Region report engaging in moderately active or activity physical activity.
