The City of Vaughan has an opportunity to stand out amongst its neighbours. Growing beyond the suburban, fueled by innovation, Vaughan's massive transformation allows businesses and talent to enjoy the excitement, opportunity and culture of urban centres with the comfort of the suburbs. Vaughan has unparalleled access to talent with the technical and business skills to make the economy succeed, via our subway and major projects like the new downtown and healthcare centre precinct.

Economic and Cultural Development has an opportunity to shift Vaughan's narrative as an edge-city in the GTA to capture the reality that ours is a world-class city with fast-moving, transformational projects Page 2 and opportunities.

How can we do this? Initial thoughts include:
