# Vaughan Transportation Plan (VTP)

- A strategic policy document that provides a framework and recommendations to guide future transportation-related studies, projects, initiatives and decisions for the next 20 years.
- The project is expected to be completed by the end of 2022

# Creating a More Age-Friendly Vaughan

- The City of Vaughan is taking steps to create a more age-friendly community, where all residents can be active and engaged members of society at every stage of life.
- It is projected that older adults (55 years and older) will make up the largest portion of the population of Vaughan, representing more than 30 per cent of the total population by 2031.

# City of Vaughan Age-Friendly Community Action Plan

## Transportation Themes Highlighted

- Create greater awareness of how to access public transportation options.
- Create volunteer network (of drivers)
- Provide transportation to libraries.
- Provide transportation options for low-income seniors.
- Establish transportation options to recreation activities, appointments grocery shopping.
- Improve lighting and signage in transit areas
- Increase transportation options for people with disabilities.
- Identify transportation needs of people living alone.
- Integrate transit systems



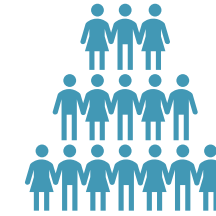


# Vaughan Transportation Plan | Vision



## Provide choice

Let people decide how they will travel by providing equally attractive options – instead of having to drive



## Move more people and goods

Improve sustainability by moving more people and goods with the same infrastructure



## Equitable

Create a transportation system that serves everyone regardless of age, ability, background, and income level



## Promote Good Health

Minimize air pollution by reducing greenhouse gases from vehicles, and build safe infrastructure for vulnerable users

# What We Learned So Far

Outreach activities were completed to learn about travel behaviours and ideas for improving travel choices in Vaughan.

Consultation activities included:

- Community Survey
- Pop-up Workshops including attending City of Vaughan Winterfest 2020
- Vaughan Business Expo 2020
- Stakeholder Workshops Engagement with the following groups:
  - Development Industry
  - Major Employers and Businesses
  - Goods Movement Businesses, Major Chains and Retailers



# What We Learned So Far

More direct and good quality walking conditions are needed

More focus on creating pedestrian-friendly streets

Poor walking conditions discourage the use of transit

Protected bike lanes are a priority

Improve cycling connections between destinations and subdivisions

Education on bike use, routes and safety



# What We Learned So Far

Bus reliability needs to be improved

Time is a factor for choosing transit over car travel

First and last mile options are important in how employees make travel choices

Traffic calming measures should be explored

Traffic congestion is a top concern for many residents

Left turning movements need to be better addressed

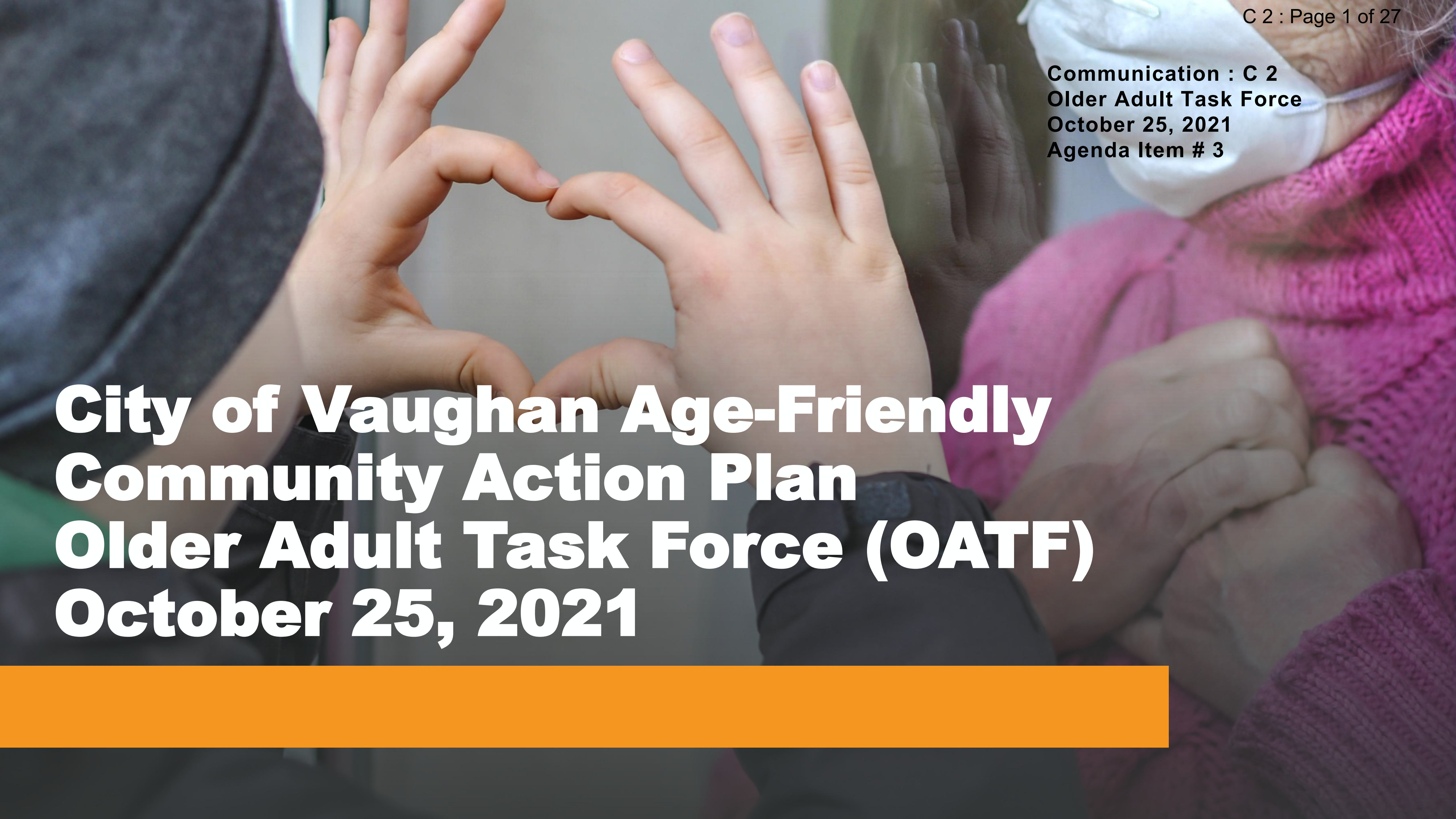

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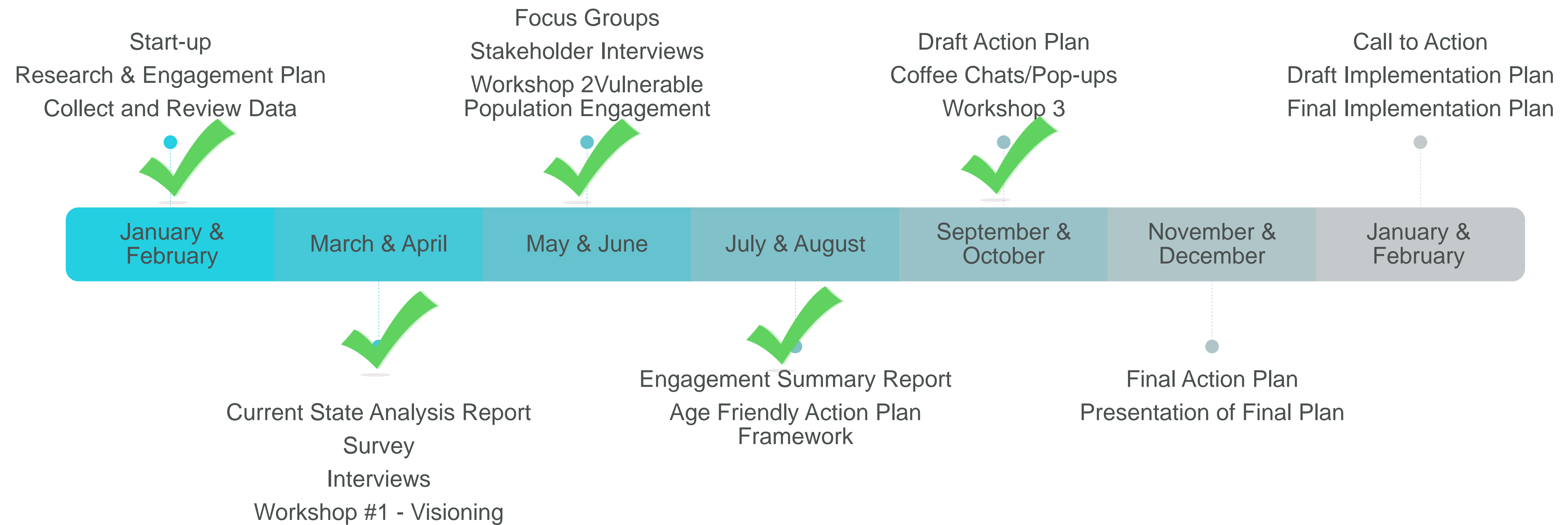

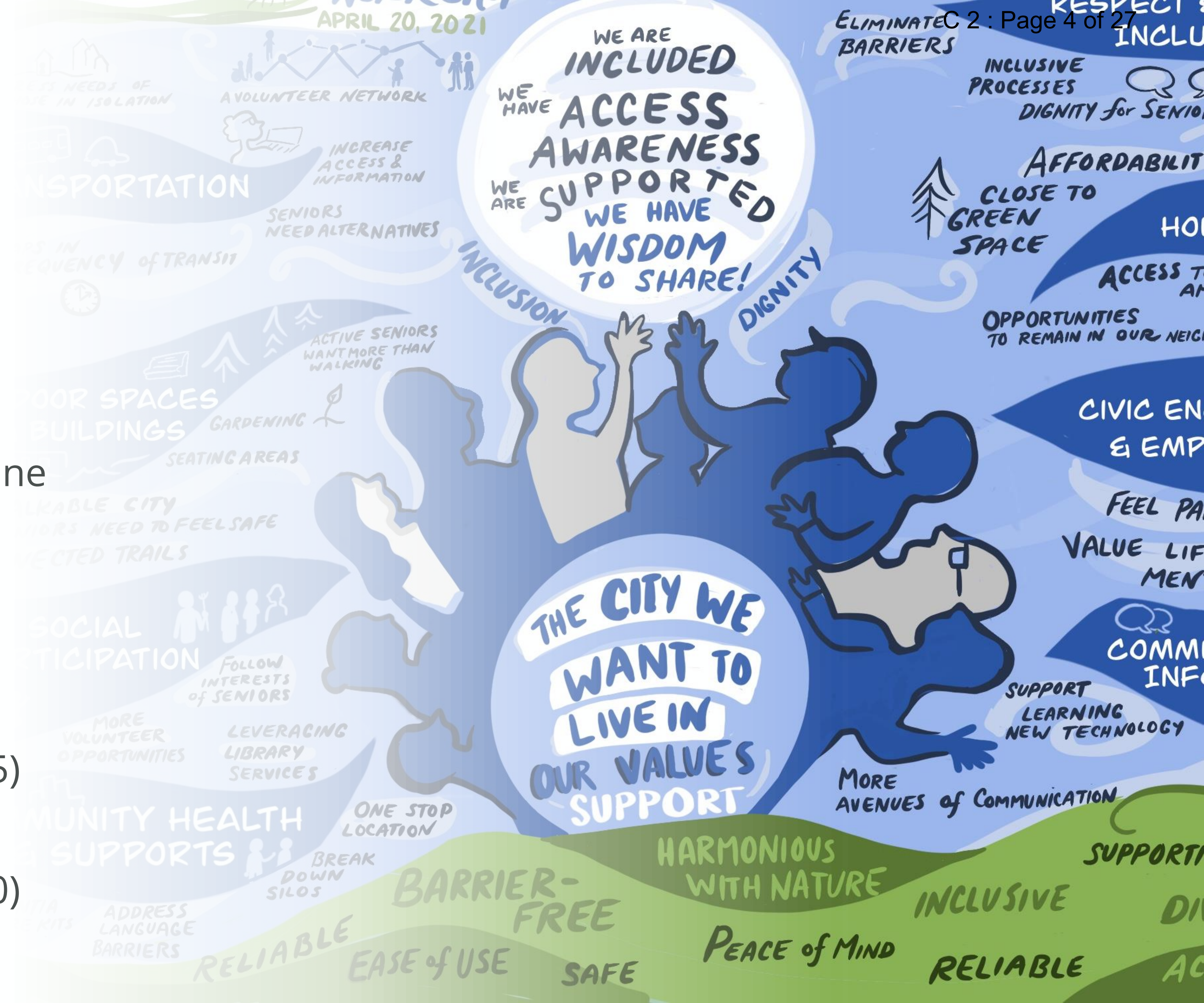

- Visioning workshop (25)
- Telephone and online surveys (641)
- Interviews (31)
- Focus groups (9)(88)
- Online questionnaire (8)
- Community workshop 2 (25)
- Community Pop-Ups (30+)
- Community workshop 3 (40)

# Identifying Challenges

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Car-dependent communities

Not all trails, outdoor spaces are accessible

Crosswalk timing not long enough

Accessing transportation

Lack of affordable housing, housing choice

Many seniors do not speak English

Ageism

Seniors not as valued as they should be

Unaware of volunteer and employment opportunities

Varying levels of comfort and access to tech

Some not aware of what services, programs are available

“Everyone should be able to get the information they need”

Caregiver burnout

Isolation

Ability to access programs and services

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The City of Vaughan is a diverse community that is supportive, accessible, and equitable where everyone can live, work, and age well and feel a sense of belonging.



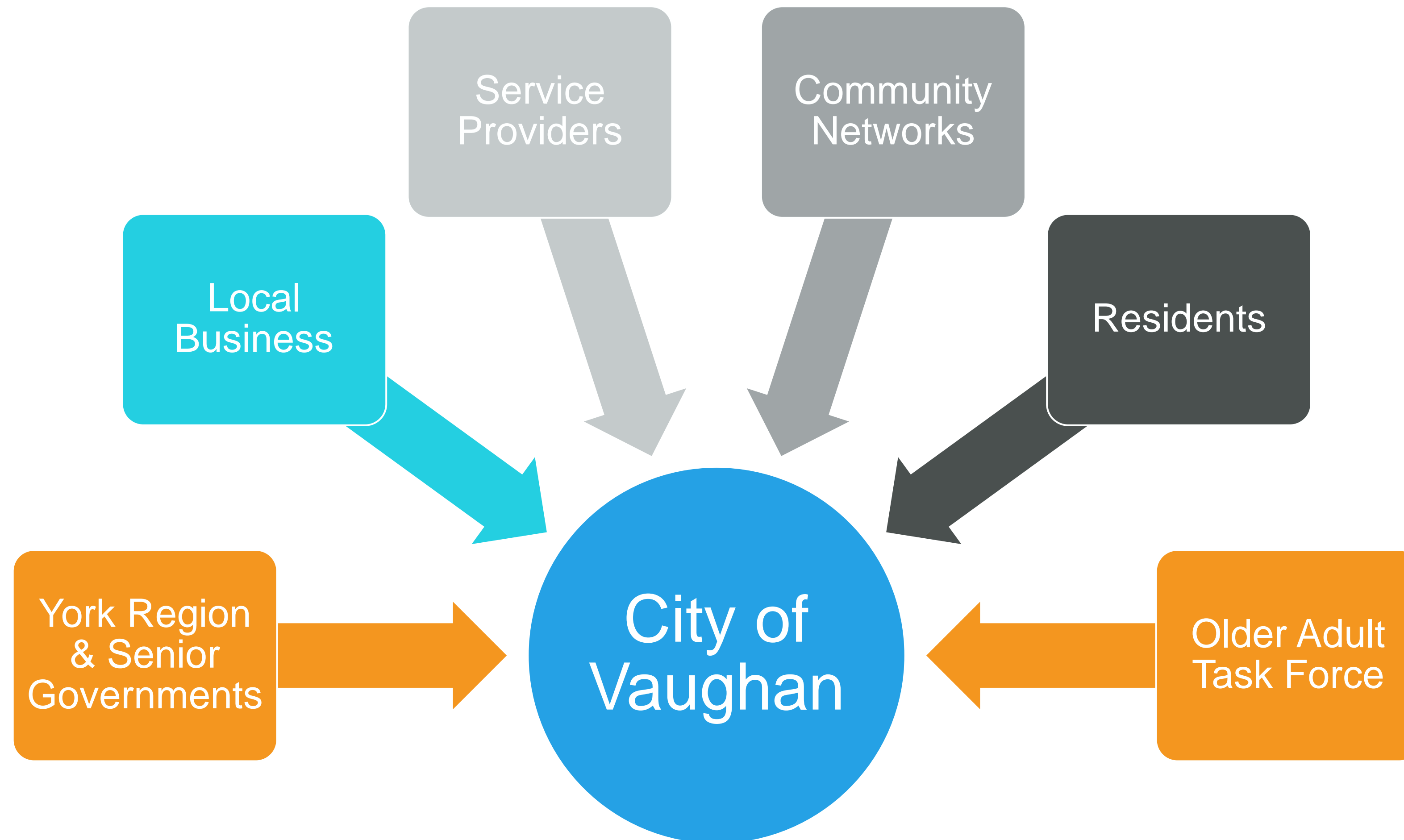
# Objectives

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- 1.To recognize the diversity of Vaughan’s aging population not only in terms of age but also ability, gender, sexual orientation, culture, support needs, and income.
- 2.To support policies that create complete, accessible, and welcoming neighbourhoods.
- 3.To support independent, active, and healthy aging for all residents.
- 4.To realize a shared responsibility among community members and partners to fulfil the vision of this Plan.
- 5.To achieve recognition of the City of Vaughan as an Age-Friendly Community through the Ontario Age-Friendly Communities Program, Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility.

# Outdoor Spaces & Buildings

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1. Expand winter snow removal program
2. Continue to ensure park and open space design incorporate accessibility, safety, and recreational opportunities
3. Continue work to improve age-friendly street design
4. Create accessible community gardens
5. Explore opportunities for more walkable communities

# Transportation

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1. Enhance bus stop accessibility, comfort and safety
2. Increase alternative transportation options
3. Increase awareness of transit options
4. Explore transit subsidy

# Housing

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1. Establish policies to support a range of affordable and accessible housing options
2. Explore Home Share program options
3. Increase awareness of home adaptation, repair, and modification programs
4. Increase in-home support options





## Respect & Social Inclusion

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1. Celebrate seniors and youth
2. Combat ageism and elder abuse
3. Explore integration of some local club events/programs
4. Increase awareness and promotion of friendly visiting programs
5. Engage and partner with community organizations to identify unique and diverse needs of older adults

# Civic Engagement & Employment

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1. Share volunteer and employment opportunities
2. Expand age-friendly awareness among local businesses
3. Engage with older adults and youth in community planning



# Communication & Information

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1. Expand digital access and literacy
2. Establish online community service hubs
3. Create positive and inclusive messaging and promotional material
4. Develop wayfinding materials



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## Community & Health Supports

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1. Explore development of a community hub
2. Encourage partnerships with local health care agencies



# Social Participation

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1. Expand diversity of recreational programs and inter-generational programs
2. Expand support to community clubs through provision of community space
