

This development will greatly impact all of us as it will increase the congestion at Kipling and Highway #7. An intersection which is already unsafe and has a traffic volume greater than it can handle.

- we support fair intensification, this includes developments that are designed to respect and reinforce the existing unique physical character of the surrounding area and follow good planning practices;
