What is a service animal?

- Trained to aid an individual with a disability
- Perform specific functions and services to assist an individual
- Not all animals wear a special harness or vest that identifies them as a service animal



Applicable laws

- The Blind Persons' Rights Act
- The Integrated Accessibility
 Standards Regulation under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act
- The Food Premises Regulation under the Health Protection and Promotion Act
- The Ontario Human Rights Code



Animal Control By-law 066-2020

- Includes definitions for:
 - service animal
 - guide dog
- Speaks to licensing of guide dogs

The City of Vaughan welcomes service animals at all municipal facilities.



Service animals and businesses

- Businesses must allow service animals into all areas customers are generally allowed.
- Businesses are not required to provide care for the animal.
- Businesses can ask for documentation on the service animal.



What should citizens do

- Put the person first
- Assume independence
- Recognize that people can bring service animals to any public space
- Don't distract service animals



Education campaign

Age-Friendly Communities

An Age-Friendly community is one that responds to both the opportunities and challenges of an aging population by creating physical and social environments that support independent active living and enable older people to continue contributing to all aspects of community life.



2022-23 Inclusive Community Grants (ICG) Program

- Grant offered by the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility
- Up to \$60,000 in funding available to each recipient
- Funding to be used towards the creation or implementation of Age-Friendly Community Action Plans
- Projects must engage older adults, including those with disabilities, or organizations that represent them
- Projects must be completed between September 2022 and March 2023



Proposed Project

Kickstart implementation of Vaughan's Age-friendly Action Plan by improving communication and engagement with members of the older-adult community.

GOALS:

- To create a "one-stop-shop" information and services portal for older adults in Vaughan
- To develop a guide to effectively engage older adults in Vaughan
